SEARCH

- Agency code format of KPD is OK; it is easier to read/understand
- When searching on Report Number is it possible to ignore leading zeros

SEARCH RESULTS

- Ethnicities: prefer use of codes specially when multiple ethnicities exist so as to use less space; e.g. HA vs. Hawaiian
- Anchor the upper section (Search Criteria), i.e. keep it from scrolling
- Single-line vs. multi-line display: the single line display should use the FC-verified information if it exists; if no verified name exists, then display all
- Display of alias information is helpful

JUVENILE HISTORY

DEMOGRAPHIC INFORMATION

- Distinguish mailing address vs. residential address
- Display juvenile employment information
- Display school grade

OFFENSE INFORMATION

- No real need for "Arrest" and "Adjudicated", just "Adjudicated"
- When there is no PD-contact date, display the offense date and order by offense date
- Remove contact date from offense summary and replace with offense date
- Include information on weapons used

COMMITMENTS

- Display current social worker and phone information in the section heading block

STAFF

- Include the circuit information for Probation Officers
- Where it shows "Parole Officer" change it to include "Social Worker" and/or "HYCF"

GENERAL

- Recommend that every agency should have representation in the weekly design sessions
- Question: Does Kauai enter LOA data?
- Use of consistence case for data, i.e. always upper-case or always mixed-case
- Prefer the colors on the Search screen to the Juvenile History screen
