The following was suggested at the Honolulu wrap-up meeting:

SEARCH SCREEN:

- Requested adding the ability to search by school

JUVENILE HISTORY SCREEN:

- There were questions regarding who inputs photos of youth that go into juvenile profiles and which juveniles they would be displayed for. Of concern is the unpinning of runaways, which neither CID or dipatch would enter and which JSD receives from the parents.
- If a juvenile's address is listed as a P.O. box or the youth is homeless (*i.e.*, lives on the beach), this makes it difficult for Family Court to handle summons.
- HPD felt that breaking Runaway/Warrant information into two sections may be less convenient.

- The red highlighted information on the SEARCH SUMMARY should also be displayed in red at the top of the JUVENILE HISTORY SCREEN.
- It was noted that users can create their own individual default format; however, if one does not exist, a default for his/her division will be automatically used.
- There was discussion as to whether or not some kind of "red flag" or highlight could be placed on youth who had a history of violent offenses or weapons offenses. Some pros were that it would help officers to know of a possibly violent offender. Other viewpoints included that (1) officers generally would not look up the youth in JJIS until after he or she was already apprehended, (2) that a red flag-type function may make officers too comfortable with youth not flagged; and (3) it may put too much of a burden on dispatch. Additionally, the concept of "Serious Juvenile Offender" is in flux among the JJIC.

MISSING WANTED

- Could school "pop up" as someone began typing in a school name. The NG JJIS template does this to a large degree already.
- Add 7-feet to the height drop down
- It was discussed if youths' addresses should be placed above PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION AREA.
- The new way to display multiple associated people and abductors was met positively.
