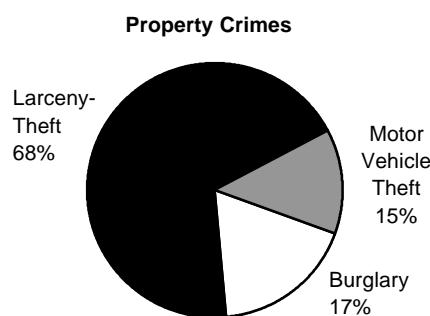
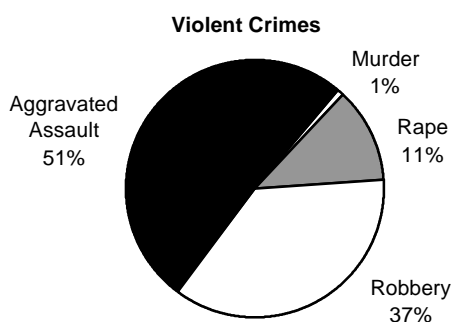

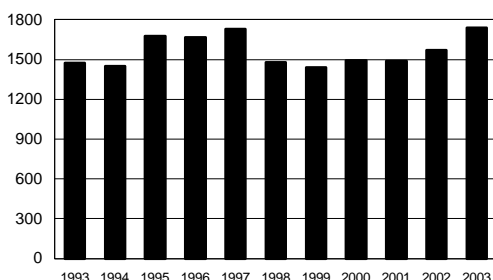
*Data derived from arrests and crimes reported to the police can only provide estimates of the actual extent of crime. Shifts in law enforcement focus, isolated cases resulting in multiple arrests, and broader societal changes that affect the likelihood that victims will report certain types of crimes are some of the factors that may affect these data.*

The number of Index Crimes<sup>1</sup> reported in Hawaii during the first six months of 2003 decreased 2.1% from the number reported during the same period in 2002. The number of reported violent crimes (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) increased 10.9%, and the number of reported property crimes (burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft) fell 2.7%.

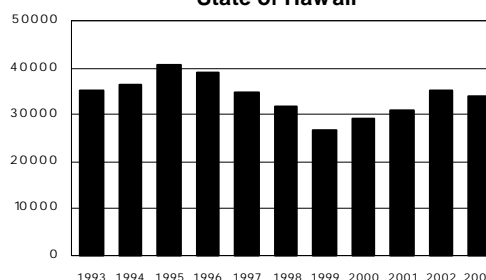
## Distribution of Reported Offenses, First Six Months of 2003

Hawaii County, Maui County and Kauai County each reported increases in total Index Crimes; the City & County of Honolulu posted a 5.7% decrease. All four counties reported an increase in violent crimes, with the largest increases in Kauai County (35.4%) and Hawaii County (22.5%). The City & County of Honolulu posted the only decrease in reported property Index Crimes, down 6.4%.

Juvenile and adult arrests for Index Crimes decreased 9.1% and 0.4%, respectively, during the first six months of 2003. At the same time, there was a 2.8% increase in juvenile arrests for Part II offenses and a corresponding 4.6% drop for adults. Kauai County reported the greatest increase in overall arrests (24.2%), while the City & County of Honolulu posted the only decrease (9.2%). The proportion of Index Crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means (11.6%) increased by 3.2 percentage points.

The value of property stolen in Hawaii during the first half of 2003 totaled \$29,389,285 million, down 8.6% from the same period in 2002.
