



Data derived from arrests and crimes reported to the police can only provide estimates of the actual extent of crime. Shifts in law enforcement focus, isolated cases resulting in multiple arrests, and broader societal changes that affect the likelihood that victims will report certain types of crimes are some of the factors that may affect these data.

The number of Index Crimes¹ reported in Hawaii during the first six months of 2005 decreased 4.4% from the number reported during the same period in 2004. The number of reported violent crimes (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) increased 6.4%, and the number of reported property crimes (burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft) fell 4.9%.

Two counties reported decreases in total Index Crimes during the first six months of 2005 as compared to the first half of 2004; the City & County of Honolulu's tallies decreased 8.9%, and Kauai County reported a 23.8% decrease. Hawaii County reported 29.5% increase in Index Crimes, and Maui County reported a 2.9% increase.

During the first half of 2005, statewide juvenile arrests for Index Crimes decreased 10.0% while adult arrests increased 3.4%. Arrests for Part II offenses decreased 1.7% and 8.2% for juveniles and adults, respectively. The City & County of Honolulu reported the greatest decrease in overall arrests (19.1%).

¹ Index Crimes include murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft.
