Explaining the Conversion from Semi-Monthly Pension Payments to Monthly Pension Payments Effective for 2011

(Act 94, 2010 SLH) as of November 2010

What are the changes for Act 94?

Effective January 2011, ERS will change how pension payments are processed as follows.

- During the transition period from January to June 2011, the payment usually paid on the 15th of each month will be gradually delayed.
- Effective July 2011, your total pension benefit will be paid at the end of each month.

Am I affected by the conversion to monthly pension payments in 2011?

Yes, if you receive this notice you are one of the 22,000+ individuals receiving semi-monthly payments that are required to convert to monthly payments.

- *** Only 2,800 will continue to receive semimonthly payments since they meet *ALL* three exemption requirements (per Act 94/2010):
- 1. Gross semi-monthly payment is \$400 or less (\$800 per month) on January 1, 2011
- 2. Attain 80 years old on January 1, 2011 (i.e. date of birth is before January 2, 1931?
- 3. Began receiving semi-monthly payments by 12/31/2002?

Questions - for those being converted?

- 1. Why are payments being gradually delayed each month during the transition period?
 - A. To allow pensioners time to adjust their finances from receiving 2 payments per month to 1 payment per month.
- 2. How will I know what my monthly pension benefit amount is when the conversion takes place in July 2011?
 - A. ERS will mail all pensioners a payment statement when the change is made for the July 29, 2011 payment. The statement will show information on your gross monthly pension payment and deductions.

Example - Convert to Monthly Payment

Mr. Aloha retired on 12/31/2002, receives a gross semi-monthly pension benefit in December 2010 of \$980 (or \$1960 per month). Deductions include \$41 in federal withheld taxes (FWT) and \$15 in other deductions.

In July 2011, Mr. Aloha will receive his annual Post Retirement (PR) increase of \$40 based on his monthly pension benefit amount. His new gross monthly pension will be \$2,000.

- The name of your benefit type will change from 'Pension Semi-Monthly' to 'Pension Monthly' effective July 2011.

Mr. Aloha will be paid as follows:

Net Pay	\$924	\$1,885

- (1) Effective July 1, 2011 (Semi-monthly + PR) \times 2 or (\$980 +20= \$1,000; \$1000 \times 2 = \$2,000)
- (2) Federal tax withholding increase in July is due to the increase in the gross pension payment subject to FWT.
- Other deductions are converted to a monthly amount ($$15 \times 2=30).

During 2011 the payment dates (with payment amounts from the previous example) are:
