STATE ID CARDS AT KAHUKU HIGH SCHOOL

(HONOLULU) State ID personnel will be available to process applications for State ID cards at Kahuku High School on Saturday, July 22, 2006, from 8:30 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The fee is \$10.00 for senior citizens 65 years and older, and \$15.00 for all others, payable in cash only.

Priority will be given to applicants with completed application forms and required <u>certified</u> documents. Applications without these documents cannot be processed.

- New applicants must provide an original social security card, or a social security health insurance card with an "A" designation after the social security number, or a valid or expired Hawaii driver's license with a social security number, <u>and</u> proof of legal name such as a certified copy of their birth certificate or a resident alien card, if applicable;
- For renewals of current ID cards with NO change in name <u>and</u> citizenship, no other documents are required;
- All changes in status or name due to marriage, divorce, annulment, adoption or citizenship must also be supported by legal, certified documents. Copied, altered or illegible documents are not acceptable.

State ID cards will be processed and mailed back to the applicant within 5-10 working days.
