DENTAL ASSISTANT CHARGED WITH ASSAULT AND DRUG VIOLATIONS

HONOLULU – Attorney General Doug Chin announced today that a Kailua woman has been charged and arrested for assault and drug violations that occurred at a Kailua dental office in 2013. Twenty-nine (29) year old Nicole “Momi” Dudoit is charged with Assault in the Second Degree and two (2) counts of Prohibited Acts Related to Controlled Substances. All three charges are class C felonies punishable by five (5) years in jail.

The charges allege that Ms. Dudoit, who was a dental assistant, gave Meperidine and Chloral-Hydrate to a two (2) year old patient who was rendered unconscious for twelve (12) hours. The patient underwent a procedure that lasted for about an hour. The excessive duration of the patient’s unconsciousness placed her life at risk, and caused a protracted loss of the function of her central nervous system.

The incident occurred at Island Dentistry for Children, Inc. Ms. Dudoit turned herself in this afternoon. Her arraignment is set for March 14, 2016 at 8:30 a.m. The case is the result of a joint investigation between the Department of Public Safety, Narcotics Enforcement Division, and the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit of the Department of the Attorney General.

Ms. Dudoit is presumed innocent unless and until she is found guilty of the charges beyond a reasonable doubt.
