

A REVIEW OF UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS

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Foreword

Crime in Hawaii 1997 is a comprehensive report of the nature and extent of crime in our state. This report is based upon the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program's monthly offense and arrest reports that are voluntarily submitted by the four county police departments to the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division of the Department of the Attorney General. We then forward the reports to the FBI. The compilation of these data would not be possible without the cooperation and support of Chief Wayne Carvalho of the Hawaii Police Department, Chief George Freitas of the Kauai Police Department, Chief Lee Donohue of the Honolulu Police Department, Acting Chief Thomas Phillips of the Maui Police Department, and their respective staffs. Special thanks go to the UCR data collection and records personnel in each of the counties: Nathan Matsuoka in Honolulu, Flora Yamanaka on the Big Island of Hawaii, Lynn Peters in Maui County, and Cynthia Edralin in Kauai County. Much of what we know about crime in Hawaii is due to the efforts of these county law enforcement agencies.

The total Index Crime rate in Hawaii decreased nearly 9% last year to its second lowest point since 1987. In the last ten years, only the 1991 rate was lower. Hawaii's crime problem continues to be defined by property crimes, with larceny-theft accounting for 69% of reported Index Offenses in 1997. Hawaii also continues to have one of the lower violent crime rates in the country, ranked 40th in 1996. However, our violent crime rate in 1997 was virtually unchanged from 1996's rate and is at its fourth highest point since 1982. Although increased by 1% in 1997, the rate for the less serious, Part II Offenses was at its second lowest point since 1986.

Three additions have been made to *Crime in Hawaii* this year, including a brief description of major considerations in reporting crime statistics, a simplified, condensed version of the Executive Summary, and a graphical comparison of county and state crime rates.

Crime is an important concern of the citizens of Hawaii. An accurate view of the nature and extent of crime is vital to both understanding the problems associated with crime and developing solutions to those problems. As resources at the federal, state, and local levels become more scarce, reliable information plays a critical role in deciding how we address crime in our communities.

Caveats

Statistical crime reporting requires a number of rules to count events consistently. Multiple offenses may be committed in most opportunities for crime, and multiple charges may be attached to a single arrest. The statistics presented in this report were collected and compiled using the FBI's Hierarchy Rule that limits crime counts to only the most serious offense committed within an incident that is constrained by time and place, and limits arrest counts to only the most serious charge per booking. Therefore, some crimes may be underreported, e.g., if the victim is killed in a single-victim robbery situation, only murder is recorded, not the crime of robbery. Further details of the Hierarchy Rule are discussed in Footnote 1 on page 1.

The number of reported offenses corresponds to a victim count for only some types of offenses. Violent crimes generally employ the total victim count. Robberies, however, are counted by the incident, regardless of the number of victims. Property crimes also are generally counted by the incident, with the notable exceptions that a burglary is counted for each structure entered, and a motor vehicle theft for each vehicle stolen.

Some crimes are inherently difficult to classify. The UCR definition of aggravated assault, for example, is complex and has been misinterpreted, resulting in large variations between agencies and between years (e.g., see page 77).

These statistics were produced from the operations of Hawaii's 4 county police departments. Statistics of prosecutorial, court, and parole board decisions are reported separately, by those agencies.

It is strongly cautioned that year-to-year changes based on small numbers of events are likely to result in large percentage changes which typically are not as meaningful as they might appear at first glance.

An unappreciated difference in the time period covered by two different sets of statistics can lead to erroneous conclusions regarding underlying relationships. For example, an abrupt change in the "percent of offenses cleared" statistics, which link the volume of arrests to the volume of reported offenses, should be viewed with caution because offenses already reported in previous years may be counted as cleared, by arrest or exceptional means, in the current year. A "clearance" is further defined in Appendix A.

The distinction between resident and de facto population is a most important consideration in viewing *Crime in Hawaii*. Crime rates are based on the number of crimes per 100,000 residents. De facto population includes the number of persons physically present in the state: residents, tourists, and non-resident military personnel. Crime rates based on de facto population can be significantly different than rates based on resident population. The UCR program uses resident population to calculate crime rates for all states. However, because of Hawaii's relatively small resident population and large visitor population, crime rates based on resident population are much higher when compared to rates based on the actual number of people in the state.

These and other issues surrounding the collection and compilation of crime and arrest data can contribute to the misinterpretation of statistics presented in this report. 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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The nature and extent of crime in Hawaii are atypical compared to many other parts of the United States. Nationally, 88% of the Index Crimes in 1996 (the last year for which national data are available) were property crimes; 12% were violent crimes. In Hawaii, 96% of the Index Crimes in 1996 were property crimes and only 4% were violent crimes; these percentages are only slightly changed for 1997, with property crimes down to 95% and violent crimes up to 5% of total reported Index Crimes.

Preliminary findings from the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program indicate that the number of reported Crime Index Offenses decreased 4% from 1996 to 1997, while in Hawaii the number of Crime Index Offenses decreased over 8%. Nationally, violent crimes decreased 5% and property crimes decreased 4%; in Hawaii, the number of violent crimes was almost unchanged and property crimes decreased 9%.

In 1996, Hawaii was ranked 41st among the 50 states and the District of Columbia on the basis of resident population, 6th for total Index Crime rate per 100,000 residents, 40th for violent Index Crime rate, and 4th for property Index Crime rate. Washington, D.C., ranked 50th in population, was 1st in total, violent, and property Index Crime rates.

In addition to those mentioned above, highlights of this report include the following:

- In 1996, Hawaii ranked 40th in the nation per 100,000 resident population for reported murders, 37th for forcible rapes, 24th for robberies, and 46th for aggravated assaults among the 50 states and the District of Columbia. In property crimes, Hawaii ranked 13th for burglaries, 2nd for larceny-thefts, and 11th for motor vehicle thefts.
- During the 15-year period of 1983-1997, the resident population of Hawaii increased 17.2% while the total number of reported Index Offenses increased 20.3%.
- Index Crimes decreased 9% statewide from 1996 to 1997. The number of reported Index Crimes decreased in 4 offense categories (robbery, burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft) and increased in 4 other categories (murder, forcible rape, aggravated assault, and arson).
- The 1997 decrease in total Index Crime continued the previous year's decrease for a 2-year decline of 17%.
- Violent offenses were marginally reduced, by 0.1%, in 1997 from 1996 in the state. However, the 1997 violent crime rate was fourth highest only to the rates in 1995, 1990, and 1996 in the past 15 years.
- Property crimes declined 9% from 1996 to 1997. While the 1995 property crime rate set a 15-year high, the 1997 rate almost came down to 1991's lowest rate in the past 10 years.
- Reported Part II Offenses increased 2% from 1996 to 1997. However, the 1997 reported Part II Offense rate was the second lowest in the past 11 years.
- The total number of arrests statewide increased 6.4% from 1996 to 1997. Arrests for violent crimes were up 2.3%; for property crimes, up 0.7%; for total Index Crimes, up 0.9%; and for Part II Offenses, up 7.7%.
- From 1996 to 1997, the number of adult arrests increased 10.1%, while juvenile arrests decreased 3.7%. Adult arrests for violent crime rose 7.3%; juvenile violent crime arrests dropped 8.6%. The increase in violent crime arrests for adults was solely due to a 19.6% rise in arrests for aggravated assault, but arrests for juveniles all 4 violent crime categories decreased. For property crime, adult arrests showed a

3.4% increase, while juvenile arrests moved down 4.0%. For total Index Crime, apprehensions of adults rose 3.9%, but juvenile arrests shrank 4.5%. Part II Offense arrests of adults swelled 11.3%, and juvenile Part II arrests retreated 3.5% from 1996 to 1997.

- From 1996 to 1997 in the City and County of Honolulu, the total number of reported Crime Index Offenses decreased 11%. Decreases were reported for 4 of the 8 Index Crimes.
- In Hawaii County, the total number of reported Index Offenses increased 7% from 1996 to 1997. All 8 Index Crimes registered increases.
- The total number of reported Index Offenses in Maui County decreased 2% from 1996 to 1997. The decrease, however, was due solely to a 6% decrease in larcenythefts, while the numbers of the other 7 Index Offenses increased.
- Down 4% in total Index Crimes, Kauai was the only county to experience decreases in more than half of the 8 crime categories from 1996 to 1997. Of the 4 violent Index Offenses, only aggravated assaults increased (up by 4 reported offenses), while burglary was the only property crime to show an increase.

STATE OF HAWAII

The total crime rate in the State of Hawaii was 29.8% higher than the national crime rate in 1996, the latest year for which national statistics are available. Hawaii's crime rate is also higher than that in the Pacific States region of Alaska, California, Oregon, Washington, and Hawaii (Hawaii's rate was 22.0% higher than the Pacific States' rate in 1996). In 1997, the total crime rate in Hawaii fell 1.9% below the state's 15-year average. The overall percentage of Index Crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means increased to 17.7% in 1997, up from 15.8% in 1996.

Based on data collected statewide beginning in 1975, the 1997 violent crime rate is fifth highest only to the 1980, 1995, 1990, and 1996 rates in descending order, exceeding the 15-year average by 6.2%. The number of murders increased from 40 in 1996 to 47 in 1997, with the murder rate remaining about 5% below the 15-year average. Of the 47 murder victims, 72% were male, 28% female. Seven murder victims were married or related to the killer, 7 were friends, 15 were acquaintances, 6 were strangers, 3 were roommates or neighbors, 1 victim was an infant killed by a babysitter, and in 8 cases the relationship was unknown.

The forcible rape rate reversed a 4-year decline with a rise of 13.4% in 1997, but remains 18.3% below Hawaii's 1992 highest rate in the past 15 years. Tied with 1986 for 7th lowest in the past 15 years, the 1997 rate was almost in the median position for this period.

The robbery rate reversed an almost steady rise, which had totaled 55.9% from 1991 to 1996's 15-year peak, with a drop of 13.0% in 1997. The 1997 rate remained 10.9% above the 15-year average.

The aggravated assault rate increased 9.2% in 1997. This rate has more than doubled (up 119.0%) since 1975.

In 1997, the property crime rate decreased 8.9% from 1996 and was down 17.3% from 1995's 15-year high point, to reach the second lowest point in the past 11 years. The 1997 property crime rate also fell to a level 2.3% below the 15-year average.

The percentage of total arrests accounted for by juveniles in 3 Index Crime categories has fallen significantly in the 1990's. Generally, throughout the 1980's, and again in 1991, more juveniles than adults were arrested for burglary, motor vehicle theft, and arson than adults. However, an analysis of arrests in three 5-year periods, 1983-1987, 1988-1992, and 1993-1997, shows that the shares of arrests for burglary and motor vehicle theft accounted for by juveniles have dropped from over 50% in the first 10 years to 39% and 28%, respectively, in the most recent 5 years. For arson, total juvenile arrests dropped from 55.9% in the first 10 years to 49.6% in the most recent 5 years.

Over \$66.4 million worth of property was reported stolen during the commission of Index Crimes in the state in 1997, down 14.3% from 1996's record high. \$13.6 million, or 20.5% of the value of property stolen in 1997, was recovered, down 2.0 percentage points from the proportion recovered in 1996. Larceny-thefts accounted for 45.7% of the reported value of property stolen, the greatest portion of which involved thefts from motor vehicles (\$8.9 million).

From 1996 to 1997, the number of drug-related arrests increased 13.8%. Among adults, the number of such arrests increased 18.9% from 2,719 to 3,233, while arrests of juveniles decreased 4.3% from 776 to 743.

Arrests for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) increased 7.8% from 1996 to 1997. The number of adults arrested for DUI increased 7.6% from 4,706 to 5,065, while the number of juveniles arrested increased 17.6% from 68 to 80.

CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU

Seventy-three percent of the residents of Hawaii live in the City and County of Honolulu. In 1997, 75% of the State's total Index Crimes, 80% of the violent crimes, and 74% of the property crimes were reported in Honolulu.

Honolulu's total Index Crime rate decreased 11.1% from 1996 to 1997. The crime rate is relatively low compared to cities of comparable population—in 1996, the total crime rate in cities with a population of 500,000 to 999,999 was 23.3% higher than in Honolulu. In 1997, Honolulu cleared 16.2% of its Index Crimes, up from 13.3% in 1996.

In 1997, the violent crime rate continued to decrease from 1995's all-time high, with a decrease of 4.1% from 1996. From 1996 to 1997, the robbery rate decreased 14.6%, while the murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault rates increased by approximately 26%, 16%, and 5%, respectively. Despite the increases, the murder rate in 1997 remained about 5% below the average murder rate for the past 15 years and, except for 1995 and 1996, 1997 had the lowest forcible rape rate since 1979.

Honolulu's property crime rate decreased 11.5% in 1997. The burglary rate was reduced 3.1% to set its second consecutive record low since the start of statewide data collection in 1975 (in 1997 it was 46.0% below the 1975 level). The larceny-theft rate, which accounted for 68% of Honolulu's total Index Offense rate in 1997, declined 13.1% from 1996 to reach its lowest point since 1988. The motor vehicle theft rate dropped 12.3% to place below 1994, 1995, and 1996, but was still sixth highest in the 23 years since the start of statewide crime data collection.

In 1997, \$50.8 million in property was reported stolen, of which \$9.8 million (19.3%) was recovered. The total value of stolen property was down 18.6% from 1996's total. Larceny-thefts accounted for 47.1% of the total value stolen.

HAWAII COUNTY

With 11.9% of the State's population, Hawaii County accounted for 10.2% of the statewide total of reported Index Offenses, 8.6% of the violent crimes, and 10.3% of the property crimes.

From 1996 to 1997, the number of reported Index Crimes increased 6.7%, while the Index Crime rate increased 5.4%. The rate remains 15.8% below 1990's highest point since the start of statewide data collection in 1975. However, the increase contributed to changing Hawaii County's lowest crime rate in the state in 1996 to a second place finish in 1997. Hawaii County had the lowest Index Crime rate in the state from 1975-1984 and 1986-1987, as well as in 1996. In 1997, a modified total of 28.5% of Index Crimes were cleared, a very slight decrease from 1996 but still highest in the state by a wide margin.

The violent crime rate in Hawaii County increased 13.6% from 1996's lowest point since 1987 to a level 2.4% above the average violent crime rate in the past 15 years. The 1997 rate was 27.4% below 1991's record high rate. All 4 violent crime categories increased in number and rate. The overall property crime rate in Hawaii County increased 5.1% in 1997; all four property crime increased in number and rate.

Almost \$4.5 million of property was reported stolen in Hawaii County in 1997, of which 20.2% was recovered. The value of property stolen increased 20.9% from 1996. Almost half of the reported value of all property stolen was lost in larceny-thefts.

MAUI COUNTY

Of the 4 counties, Maui County has experienced the greatest population growth (48%) during the past 15 years. From 1996 to 1997, the number of reported Index Crimes decreased 1.9%. The clearance rate for Index Crimes decreased 3.8 percentage points, from 22.4% in 1996 to 18.6% in 1997.

The violent crime rate increased 20.0% from 1996 to 1997 and is up 45.8% from 1993's lowest point since 1976. The 1997 rate is 2.5% above the 15-year average. The number of reported violent crimes rose 21.5% in 1997, as a result of rises in all 4 violent crime categories (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault). The robbery rate, while up just 0.5% from 1996 to 1997, set its second consecutive record high since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975. Among the counties, Maui's robbery rate was just over two-thirds as high as Honolulu's rate, but almost twice the Hawaii County rate and 7 times the Kauai County rate.

The property crime rate decreased 4.0% from 1996 to 1997, while the number of reported property offenses decreased by 2.7%. However, among the 4 property crimes, only larceny-thefts decreased, by 6.3%.

The property reported stolen in 1997 was valued at almost \$9 million, up 10.7% from 1996. In 1997, almost \$2.6 million, or 28.8% of the stolen value, was recovered. Among the 4 counties, for the sixth consecutive year, Maui had the highest percent of stolen property recovered. Larceny-thefts accounted for 35.5% of the value of property stolen in Index Crimes.

KAUAI COUNTY

Kauai County had the lowest total crime rate in the state for 1997. Kauai's 1997 total Index Crime rate decreased 4.0% from 1996 but remains 18.6% above 1994's minimum rate since the 1975 start of statewide data collection. The 1997 Index clearance rate was 15.8%, down from 18.5% in 1996

The violent crime rate in Kauai County decreased 7.8% from 1996 to 1997, setting its third record low in the past 4 years. During the past year, there were 4 more reported aggravated assault offenses, while the other 3 violent crimes decreased in number and rate.

The property crime rate in Kauai County reversed its steady increase since 1993's record low with a decrease of 3.9% in 1997. The 1997 property crime rate remains 20.7% above the 1993 minimum and is 3.9% above the 15-year average. From 1996 to 1997, reported burglaries increased, while the other 3 property crime categories reported decreases. The motor vehicle theft rate fell 3.3% to set a new record low since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975.

The value of property reported stolen in 1997 totaled \$2.2 million, of which 13.9% was recovered. The total stolen in 1997 was 33.6% less than in 1996. Half of the value of property stolen in 1997 was taken in larceny-thefts.

State of Hawaii

Reported serious crimes in Hawaii have substantially decreased in the past 2 years; decreasing 8.6% in 1997, and 9.1% in 1996. By 1995, Hawaii's rate for serious crimes had almost reached 1980's record high point. Since 1995, the crime rate declined 16.9% to reach its lowest point since 1991. In fact, except for 1991, 1997's rate was the lowest in the past 10 years.

Hawaii's larceny-theft rate fell significantly for the second consecutive year in 1997. Larceny-thefts, which have consistently accounted for about 70% of Hawaii's Index (serious) Crimes, declined by almost 11,000 offenses (18.2%) since 1995—8.7% in 1996 and an additional 10.5% in 1997.

Robbery, which was the only Index Crime to increase from 1995 to 1996, fell by 12.6% in 1997. The robbery rate was at a 15-year high point in 1996. The significant decrease in robberies offset increases in the other 3 violent crimes, with violent crimes decreasing overall by 0.1%.

Hawaii's reported burglary rate in 1997 was the lowest since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975.

Over 1,700 fewer thefts of motor vehicles were reported in 1997 than in 1995, a drop of 21.1% in two years.

Juvenile arrests decreased in 1997: 4.5% for Index Crimes, 8.6% for violent crimes, 4.0% for property crimes, and 3.5% for Part II Offenses.

Murders, forcible rapes, and aggravated assaults

increased in 1997 by 17.5%,

13.8%, and 9.5%,

respectively.

Even with this decrease, the 1997 motor vehicle theft rate was still third highest in the past 15 years.

Adult arrests increased: 3.9% for Index Crimes, 7.3% for violent crimes, 3.4% for property crimes, and 11.3% for Part II Offenses.

City and County of Honolulu Honolulu's Index Crime rate declined 11.1% in 1997, slightly exceeding the 10.6% drop in 1996. The decline since 1995 totaled 20.5%, and, as in the state, placed the rate at its lowest point since 1991.

In 1996, the latest year for which national figures are available, Honolulu's Index Crime rate was 18.9% lower than cities of comparable size (population between 500,000 and 999,999).

Larceny-thefts decreased by over 10,000 offenses (22.0%) from 1995 to 1997. The decline in 1996 was 10.2% and in 1997, 13.1%. Fewer larcenies were reported than in any year since 1988.

As in the state, robbery was the only violent crime to decrease, by 14.6%, resulting in a decrease in total violent crimes of 4.1%.

Burglaries reported to HPD in 1997 numbered 3.0% fewer than in 1996 and the fewest since the start of statewide crime data in 1975. The burglary rate reached a record low point for the second consecutive year and was down 46.0% from 1975's rate.

Honolulu continued to experience by far the highest motor vehicle theft rate in the state in 1997. However, of two counties posting decreased motor vehicle theft rates in 1997, Honolulu had the larger decrease, down 12.3% (and falling 24.9% in the last 2 years).

The value of property stolen attributable to Index Crimes dropped 18.6% from \$62.4 million in 1996 to \$50.8 million in 1997.

Murders, forcible rapes, and aggravated assaults increased by 25.9%, 15.8%, and 4.9%, respectively.

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The Uniform Crime Reporting Program

BACKGROUND

The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) to meet a recognized need for a nationwide system to collect crime statistics. Since there are numerous differences in criminal codes throughout the United States, the UCR program uses a standard definition for each offense. Law enforcement agencies submit data in accordance to these definitions rather than local statutes. This standardization allows for interjurisdictional comparisons and internal validity of national totals.

The national UCR program is administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Definitions of specific offenses, as well as reporting criteria, are contained in the FBI's publication *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook*. The FBI provides report forms and training to city, county, and state law enforcement agencies. Crime data are collected by over 16,000 local enforcement agencies and reported to the FBI. The FBI assembles, publishes, and distributes a comprehensive annual publication entitled *Crime in the United States*, as well as periodic special reports.

In an effort to streamline procedures and provide consistency and comparability of data, the FBI promoted the development of state UCR programs. The purpose of the state-level UCR program is to collect data from local law enforcement agencies and assure compliance with standards developed jointly by the FBI and IACP.

Hawaii's UCR program was housed in the Judiciary from its inception in 1975 until 1981, when it was transferred to the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center, a Division of the Department of the Attorney General. In 1991, the program was transferred from the Data Center to the Research and Statistics Branch of the Crime Prevention Division, which in 1995 became the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division.

The Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division collects, reviews, edits, and records in computer files the UCR reports received from the 4 county police departments before sending the original reports to the FBI. The Division is also responsible for providing technical assistance to the contributing agencies, as well as serving as the FBI's single point of contact in the state for distributing program information.

CRIME STATISTICS

Consistent with the UCR objectives of providing the best representation of total crime and providing the most meaningful data to police departments, the UCR program collects data on reported offenses and arrests. It is widely understood that offenses known to police are an underrepresentation of the total number of crimes committed, and that a truly reliable measure of unreported crimes is difficult to obtain. However, the use of reported offenses as official statistics can be verified and compared over time.

Because of their seriousness and frequency of occurrence, 7 offenses were initially chosen by the IACP to comprise a Crime Index and serve as indicators of our nation's crime experience: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter; forcible rape; robbery; aggravated assault; burglary; larceny-theft; and motor vehicle theft. In 1979, a congressional mandate added arson as the eighth Crime Index Offense.¹

¹ Hawaii has collected arson offense data since 1980. Nationally, a number of jurisdictions do not report arson offenses to the FBI. Also, the Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson offenses. This means that all arsons which become known to the police are counted, so that crime incidents which include arson and one or more of the other

Information reported for Index Offenses includes: the number of crimes committed; the number of offenses cleared by arrest or by exceptional means²; the number of persons arrested, and the value of property destroyed by arson and taken in each of the remaining offenses, except aggravated assault. (By definition, property cannot be taken in an assault. An offense that begins as an assault but ends with property being taken is classified as robbery.) The 8 Crime Index offenses plus the crime of negligent manslaughter are referred to as Part I offenses. While complete information is collected on nontraffic-related negligent manslaughters, the offense is rare and not mentioned in *Crime in the United States*. Part II offenses include all other offenses, except traffic, not included in Part I. The national UCR program collects and reports only arrest data for Part II offenses, while *Crime in Hawaii* additionally features reported Part II offense statistics.³ The total Part II Offense and clearance data were obtained from the annual reports of the 4 county police departments. Total negligent manslaughter arrests, including traffic-related, are included in *Crime in Hawaii* with the Part II arrests.

Definitions of terms used in this report appear in Appendices A and B. More detailed descriptions of the UCR program can be obtained from the *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook* published by the FBI of the United States Department of Justice. Trends in law enforcement officers killed and assaulted (LEOKA) are reported in Appendix C.

Population estimates used to calculate crime rates for *Crime in Hawaii 1997* are contained in Appendix D. Revised population estimates for 1990-1996 were used to recalculate crime rates for those prior years in *Crime in Hawaii 1997*. As a result, some of the rates differ from those published in *Crime in Hawaii 1996*; however, all changes differ by less than 1% from previously reported rates.

UCR program rules for classifying and counting crimes are somewhat complex and can, at times, even appear contradictory. Prior to delving into the pages that follow, first-time readers of *Crime in Hawaii* are encouraged to read the "Caveats" page, which precedes the Forward. All readers are requested to review this page when attempting to answer questions about how crimes and arrests are counted, and to contact us if their questions remain unanswered. Contact information is at the bottom of the "Caveats" page.

STATE RESPONSE TO NATIONAL PROGRAM DEVELOPMENTS

The current UCR program in Hawaii is summary-based. It does not collect data on individual crime incidents or victim characteristics (except for murder), or differentiate between military, visitor, or resident victims or offenders. A statistical reporting system that would provide these capabilities was promulgated by the FBI in 1988. The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) collects individual records relating to each crime incident and its associated arrest (if any), in contrast to the UCR program's monthly summary counts of offenses, clearances, arrests, and totals of the value of property stolen and recovered in the

Index Offenses are counted twice. As a result, the FBI does not include arsons in calculating and reporting total Index Crimes or property crimes and their respective crime rates. In order to remain consistent with federal reporting, Hawaii also does not include arsons in total Index Crimes and property crimes. Arson offenses are also not counted in the grand total of Index & Part II Offenses, the far right column on the 15-year offense summary pages for the state and counties.

² An offense cleared by exceptional means is one in which the offender and his or her exact location are known to the law enforcement agency but, for reasons beyond the control of the agency, the offender cannot be arrested. See Appendix A for definition and examples.

³ See Appendix B for definitions of Part II Offenses.

various crime categories. The increased volume and complexity of data in NIBRS make the system costly, and implementation has been slow, especially in major cities with high crime rates.


A second current national development is the implementation of the federal Hate Crimes Statistics Act of 1990. The Act provided for a 5-year period of data collection of crimes motivated by race, religion, ethnicity, or sexual orientation. The Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (Crime Act) amended the 1990 Act to include crimes against the disabled. The FBI's mandate to collect and report Hate Crime statistics was made permanent by the Church Arson Prevention Act of 1996. As of 1996, Hawaii is the only state that does not participate in the Hate Crimes Statistics program.


In 1992, the Hawaii Legislature provided funds to determine if the Hawaii UCR program is adequate, effective, and efficient and to recommend an appropriate course of action as needed to satisfy the crime statistics and information requests of the State of Hawaii and its contributing law enforcement agencies. The proposed alternatives needed to be compatible with the requirements of NIBRS and be capable of capturing data regarding Hate Crimes.

The contract to conduct the comprehensive study of the UCR program was awarded to SEARCH, The National Consortium for Justice Information and Statistics, in July 1993. The final report, which included a recommendation for a three-phase implementation of an incident-based reporting system, was presented to the Legislature in January, 1994. However, authorization to proceed with the suggested plan was not approved.

In the 1998 legislative session, a measure to define and require the reporting of Hate Crimes committed in the state, and prescribe enhanced sentencing for these crimes was not acted upon by the Legislature.


Crime Clock State of Hawaii, 1997







Comparison of Crime Rates by County

The above charts depict the rates of the 3 major types of crime reported to the police per 100,000 estimated Hawaii residents in 1997. There was greater variation among the counties in the rates of reported violent crime than in the rates of reported property crime. Honolulu had the highest violent crime rate, and, with 73% of the state's resident population, raised the state's overall rate to a higher level than was observed in any of the 3 rural (neighbor island) counties. Maui County's highest property crime rate can, at least partially, be attributed to having the highest relative tourist population (which is not included in the denominator of resident population used to calculate crime rates).

STATE OF HAWAII

HIGHLIGHTS

The nature of crime in Hawaii is different from the United States in general. Nationally, violent crimes accounted for 12% of the Crime Index in 1996 (the last year for which figures are available), while in Hawaii in 1997 only 5% of the Crime Index was comprised of violent crimes.

The number of reported Index Offenses decreased 8.3% from 1996 to 1997 in Hawaii to the lowest level since 1992. Following 4 years of consecutive record highs, the 1997 number of total Index Offenses is now the sixth highest since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975, behind fifth place 1980. During the past year, reported violent offenses decreased 0.1% and reported property offenses decreased 8.6%. However, the number of reported offenses in Hawaii decreased in only 4 of the 8 Index Crimes from 1996 to 1997. Increasing were murders, forcible rapes, aggravated assaults, and arsons. Reported Part II Offenses (including nonvehicular negligent manslaughter and the status offenses of curfew violation/loitering, runaway, truancy, and ungovernability) increased 1.7%, but the grand total of Index & Part II Offenses experienced a reduction of 2.4% from 1996 to 1997. (While Part II Offenses are not collected by the UCR program, these data are available in the annual reports of the 4 county police departments.)

The table below lists the actual numbers of reported crimes and status offenses, excluding traffic offenses, in the State of Hawaii during the past 15 years. Five Index Offense categories show higher offense totals than in 1983, while the number of reported offenses is lower in 3 categories.



The total crime rate in the State of Hawaii decreased 8.6% from 1996 to 1997, bringing the decline from the 15-year peak in 1995 to 16.9%. The 1997 total crime rate was the lowest crime rate since 1991 and the second lowest in the past 10 years. The 1997 total crime rate fell to 1.9% below the state's 15-year average of 6,144.0 Index Offenses per 100,000 residents but stands 2.7% above the crime rate 15 years ago.

The total crime rate in Hawaii is higher than the national crime rate. The national rate, after increasing for 7 consecutive years from 1984 to 1991, fell for 5 consecutive years, by a total of 13.9% from 1991 to 1996, to 5,078.9 offenses per 100,000 residents (1996 is the last year for which national and regional figures are available). The total crime rate in the Pacific States¹ was 5,400.8 per 100,000, 18.1% below the 1996 rate in Hawaii.



Violent crimes (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) account for 4.6% of Hawaii's total Crime Index. In 1997, the violent crime rate in the State of Hawaii decreased 1.0% from 1996's second highest point in the past 15 years to post the fourth highest rate in the same period. The violent crime rate has now decreased 6.6% from the 15-year peak in 1995. The past year's decrease was solely due to fewer robberies; all of the other violent crimes registered increases. The violent crime rate in 1997 was at its fifth highest point since the 1975 start of statewide crime data collection, with the highest rate in the past 23 years occurring in 1980. The violent crime rate for 1997 is 6.2% higher than the 15-year average of 261.7 violent crimes per 100,000 residents and 9.1% above the 1983 rate.

The 1996 violent crime rate in Hawaii was 55.7% below the 1996 national rate of 634.1 per 100,000 residents and 63.0% below the Pacific States' rate of 758.0 per 100,000 residents.





There were 23 fewer reported violent offenses in the State of Hawaii in 1997 than in 1996, a decrease of 0.1%. During the same period, the number of clearances increased by 194, or 14.5%. The percentage of offenses cleared in 1997 is 6.2 percentage points above the percentage cleared in 1996. Expect for the offense of murder, the clearance count was modified due to the closing of a backlog of cases by Hawaii County Police in the first half of 1997. The resulting numbers of clearances were larger than expected, so clearance counts were limited to offenses reported in 1995-1997.


VIOLENT CRIMES REPORTED BY MONTH

State of Hawaii, 1997





Murder represents the smallest portion of the State's total Crime Index. The 47 murders in 1997 account for 0.07% of the total Index and 1.4% of the violent crimes. From 1996 to 1997, the murder rate increased 17.6%, representing an increase of 7 murders, to a level that is 4.8% below the 15-year average of 4.2 per 100,000 residents. The 1997 rate stands 28.6% below 1983's highest rate in the past 15 years.

In 1996, the national murder rate of 7.4 per 100,000 was over twice the rate in Hawaii. The murder rate in the Pacific States was even higher: 8.0 per 100,000 residents in 1996.





Robberies comprise 2.1% of the state's total Crime Index and 44.8% of the violent Index Offenses. After generally declining from 1983 to 1989, the robbery rate in the State of Hawaii increased 61.7% from 1989 to 1996, before beginning to fall again in 1997. The 1997 decrease from 1996's 15-year peak rate amounted to 13.0%, leaving the 1997 rate at a point 10.9% above the 15-year average of 106.6 robberies per 100,000 residents but 10.0% below 1983's third highest rate in the past 15 years. The 1997 robbery rate is the fourth highest rate in the past 15 years, but only the twelfth highest in the 23 years since the start of statewide crime data collection.

In 1997, 11.8% of the robberies involved a firearm, 7.8% a knife or cutting instrument, 2.5% other dangerous weapons, and 78.0% strong-arm (hands, fists, feet, etc.).



Aggravated assaults represent 2.1% of the State of Hawaii's Crime Index and 44.8% of the violent offenses. Following 6 years of steady increase, the aggravated assault rate in Hawaii fell 21.4% from 1990 to 1991. From 1991 to 1995, the rate steadily increased again, by 12.2%, but fell 14.0% from 1995 to 1996. In 1997, the rate increased 9.2% to tie 1994's rate for sixth highest in the past 23 years. From 1975-1982, the aggravated assault rate varied little, posting the 23-year low of 56.9 in 1975 and reaching a high point of 65.5 in 1980. The 1997 rate is 4.8% above the 15-year average of 118.9 offenses per 100,000 residents and 41.6% higher than the 1983 rate.



In 1997, property offenses (burglary, larceny-theft, and motor vehicle theft) accounted for 95.4% of Hawaii's Crime Index. The property crime rate in the State of Hawaii decreased 8.9% from the 1996 rate and 17.3% from 1995's highest rate in the past 15 years to almost tie 1991's lowest rate in the past 10 years. The property crime rate was lower at the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975 than in 1997, but from 1976-1982 the rate remained higher than in 1997, prior to falling below 1997's rate from 1983-1987. The 1997 property crime rate also fell 2.3% below the 15-year average of 5,882.2 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants. The 1997 rate is 2.4% higher than the property crime rate in 1983.

In 1996, the property crime rate in the United States was 4,444.8 per 100,000, 29.6% lower than the 1996 property crime rate in Hawaii. During that same year, the property crime rate in the Pacific States was 4,642.9 per 100,000, 26.4% lower than in Hawaii.






PROPERTY CRIMES REPORTED BY MONTH

State of Hawaii, 1997







From 1996 to 1997 the larceny-theft rate decreased 10.7%. Historically, rates were lower in 1975-1977 than in 1997, while from 1978-1982 the rates were higher. The 1997 larceny-theft rate is 2.6% lower than the 15-year average of 4,238.7 thefts per 100,000 residents but 7.4% higher than the 1983 rate.


The 1996 larceny rate in Hawaii was 55.4% higher than the national rate of 2,975.9 and was 56.9% higher than the 1996 rate in the Pacific States: 2,947.8 per 100,000.

There were 5,717 fewer larcenies reported in the State of Hawaii in 1997 than in 1996, representing a 10.5% decrease. From 1996 to 1997, there were also 120 (1.3%) fewer clearances, resulting in a 1997 percentage of thefts cleared that is 1.6 percentage points higher than in 1996.

In 1997, 9.0% of all Index Offenses and 9.5% of all property crimes were motor vehicle thefts. Following a steep and steady rise totaling 106.3% from 1991 to 1995, the motor vehicle theft rate in the State of Hawaii decreased 21.6% from 1995 to 1997. From 1996 to 1997, the rate decreased 9.9%, placing the 1997 rate third highest in the past 15 years and almost returning it to the 1994 level. The 1997 rate is also the sixth highest rate since the 1975 start of statewide crime data collection, below the rates in 1995, 1979, 1980, 1996, and 1978 in decending order. The 1997 motor vehicle theft rate stands at a level 25.1% above the 15-year average of 435.9 and is 28.5% higher than the 1983 rate.

The motor vehicle theft rate for the United States in 1996 was 525.9 per 100,000 population, 13.1% lower than in Hawaii. The theft rate for the Pacific States in 1996 was 704.0 per 100,000 population, 16.4% higher than Hawaii's rate for the same year.

In 1997, there were 689 fewer motor vehicles reported stolen in Hawaii than in 1996, a decrease of 9.6%. From 1996 to 1997, the number of clearances increased by 70 (9.0%), and the resulting percentage of motor vehicle thefts cleared rose by 2.3 percentage points.



Arson offenses are reported to the UCR Program separately from the other 7 Index Offenses, only 1 of which may be reported for each crime incident in accordance with the Hierarchy Rule. The 1997 arson rate rose 7.4% from 1996's minimum rate since the start of arson data collection in 1980 to place fifth lowest since 1980. However, the arson rate has been quite stable since 1991, showing a net increase of just 3.2% over the past 6 years. The 1997 arson rate is 17.1% lower than the 15-year average of 38.6 offenses per 100,000 residents and 33.6% lower than in 1983.

For those jurisdictions reporting arson data to the UCR Program in 1996, the rate totaled 44.3 per 100,000, 48.7% higher than the rate in Hawaii for that year. For those jurisdictions in the Western States¹ reporting arson data, the 1996 rate was 49 per 100,000, 64% higher than in Hawaii in 1996.



Arson of structures accounted for 38% of the number of arsons in the State of Hawaii in 1997 and 55% of the value lost as a result of arson. Single occupancy residences were involved in only 8% of arson offenses but accounted for 24% of the value of property destroyed by arson. The subcategory with the greatest number of arsons was motor vehicles, which accounted for 40% of the value of property destroyed.

The highest average property loss occurred in "other mobile property" (\$22,000), followed by storage structures (\$21,171). The lowest average value of property destroyed by arson involved "other residential" structures, (\$1,040) per offense.

There were no arsons of industrial/manufacturing structures in 1997. This category has been deleted from the state and county "Value of Property Destroyed by Arson" tables.

The reported Part II Offense rate in the State of Hawaii increased steadily from 1983 to 1989 and has since fluctuated in the upper half of the previous range. In 1997, the Part II Offense rate increased 1.3% from 1996 but remains 10.1% below 1989's 15-year peak. 

The reported Total Index and Part II Offense rate in the State of Hawaii decreased 2.7% from 1996 to 1997, bringing the total decline from 1995's 15-year peak rate to 9.4%. CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU

HIGHLIGHTS

The character of crime in the State of Hawaii is clearly reflected in offense statistics for the City and County of Honolulu. In 1997, 73.3% of the State's population resided in the City and County of Honolulu. During 1997, 74.7% of the State's Index Crimes, 79.9% of the violent crimes, and 74.5% of the property crimes were reported in the City and County of Honolulu.

From 1996 to 1997, the number of reported offenses for 4 of the 8 Index Crimes decreased in the City and County of Honolulu. The total number of reported Index Crimes decreased 11.1%, the number of reported violent crimes decreased 4.1%, and the number of reported property crimes decreased 11.4%. The greatest percentage decrease from 1996 to 1997 occurred in the number of robberies, 14.6%. The number of reported larceny-thefts decreased 13.1% from 1996 to 1997, and motor vehicle thefts decreased 12.3%. Reported burglaries numbered 3.0% fewer in 1997 than in 1996. Increasing over the year were reports of murder, up 25.9%; forcible rape, up 15.8%, and aggravated assault, up 4.9%. Arson reports rose by 3.1%. Reported Part II Offenses showed a 1.5% increase, while the Index & Part II grand total decreased 4.2% from 1996 to 1997.

A special report on motor vehicle theft released by the Attorney General in February, 1997 found that many vehicle thefts in Honolulu are being reported without a value lost, indicating that the total value stolen in Index Crimes (see page 46) may be considerably greater than the amount we have been able to report since perhaps the mid-1980's.

The table below lists the actual number of reported offenses, except traffic, in the City and County of Honolulu during the past 15 years. In 1997, there were fewer murders, robberies, burglaries, and arsons than in 1983.



The total crime rate in the City and County of Honolulu decreased 11.1% from 1996 to 1997, extending the decline from 1995's record high point to a total of 20.5%. The total crime rate in 1997 is the lowest since 1991, after which the rate increased for 4 consecutive years prior to the relief of the past 2 years. The 1997 rate is 1.7% below the 15-year-average of 6,243.8 Index Offenses per 100,000 residents but 4.8% higher than the rate in 1983.


The total crime rate in Honolulu in 1996 was 18.9% below the total rate in U.S. cities with populations between 500,000 and 999,999 which completed crime reports for 1996. The population of Honolulu in 1996 was estimated at 869,000. The total rate in cities this size was 8,516.7 per 100,000 residents. Violent crimes accounted for 4.9% of the Index Crimes reported in the City and County of Honolulu in 1997. The violent crime rate continued to decrease in 1997, reduced by 4.1% from 1996's rate and by 8.9% from 1995's record high rate. Since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975, 1980 had the second highest violent crime rate, followed by 1996, with 1997 placing fourth. The 1997 violent crime rate was 9.5% above the 15-year average of 276.6 offenses per 100,000 residents and 11.9% above the violent crime rate in 1983.


The 1996 reported violent crime rate in Honolulu was only 22% to 25% as high as in cities of comparable size. The 1996 violent crime rate in cities with populations of 250,000 or more was 1,276.1 per 100,000, while in cities with populations of 500,000 to 999,999, the rate was 1,443.7 violent crimes per 100,000.

The murder rate in the City and County of Honolulu rose 25.8% from 1996 to 1997, erasing more than half of the decline that had occurred in 1996 from 1995's peak rate for the 1990's. However, the 1997 murder rate remained 4.9% below the 15-year average of 4.1 murders per 100,000 residents and 31.6% below the murder rate in 1983.

Ten of Honolulu's 34 murder victims in 1997, or 29.4% of the total, died in shootings: 7 with handguns, 1 with a rifle, and 2 with unknown type firearms. Eight murders (23.5%) resulted from strongarm methods, while knives or cutting instruments were used to kill 8 more of the victims. Seven victims (20.6%) died of beating with a hammer, a chair, a large stick, and an unknown type sharp instrument, striking with a pick-up truck, crushing by release of a vehicle on jacks, and falling from a building at the end of a fight. One victim (2.9%) was a suspected assisted suicide with prescription drugs.


The 1996 murder rate in Honolulu was approximately 17% to 18% of that in cities of comparable size. The 1996 murder rate for cities with populations of 250,000 or more was 18.4 per 100,000 residents; for cities with populations of 500,000 to 999,999, the murder rate was 17.2 per 100,000 residents.

The forcible rape rate in the City and County of Honolulu increased by 15.7% in 1997, bringing the total increase to 18.0% since 1995's lowest rate in the past 20 years. Despite the increases, the 1997 rate remains the third lowest in the past 15 years. The 1997 rape rate was 7.2% below the 15-year average of 31.8 offenses per 100,000 residents and 6.6% lower than the rate in 1983.



Following a period of general increase totaling 68.0% from 1989 to 1996, the robbery rate in the City and County of Honolulu fell 14.6% from 1996 to 1997. The 1997 rate remains 10.1% higher than the 15-year average of 126.8 robberies per 100,000 residents but is 11.4% less than the rate in 1983.

Robberies committed with firearms accounted for 9.9% of all robberies in the City and County in 1997. Knives were used in an additional 7.1% of Honolulu's robberies, while strong-arm methods accounted 81.5% and other weapons were used in 1.6% of the robberies.



The aggravated assault rate in the City and County of Honolulu increased 4.8% from 1996 to 1997. Historically, the assault rate rose sharply from 1986 to 1990, then decreased 27% from 1990 to 1991, only to rise steadily by 36% from 1991 to 1995 and nearly regain the 1990 record. From 1995 to 1996, the rate took another large 1-year drop (14%) before rebounding again in 1997. The aggravated assault rate in 1997 is at a level 14.2% above the 15-year average of 113.8 offenses per 100,000 residents, placing fourth highest in the past 15 years, and is 71.3% above the 1983 rate.

Firearms were the type of weapon used in 15.3% of Honolulu's aggravated assaults in 1997. Knives were used in an additional 9.7% of the assaults, while physical force accounted for 53.0% and other weapons were used for 22.0% of the aggravated assaults.


The reported aggravated assault rate in Honolulu is far below the average rate for U.S. cities of comparable size, just 16% to 19% as high, and very similar to the ratio of the murder rate for Honolulu to the national murder rate for cities of comparable size. Cities with populations of 250,000 or more had a rate in 1996 of 757.8 assaults per 100,000 residents. Cities with populations of 500,000 to 999,999 had a 1996 rate of 659.7 assaults per 100,000 residents.

Property crimes accounted for 95.1% of the Index Crimes reported in the City and County of Honolulu in 1997. The 1997 property crime rate decreased 11.5% from the rate in 1996 and is down 21.1% from 1995's record high point. The 1997 rate is the lowest since 1991 and below all of the annual rates posted in the 1975-1982 period. The property crime rate in Honolulu in 1997 was 2.2% below the 15-year average of 5,967.2 offenses per 100,000 residents but 4.5% above the property crime rate in 1983.



The burglary rate in the City and County of Honolulu decreased 3.1% in 1997 from the previous record low in 1996 to post its second consecutive minimum since the start of statewide data collection in 1975. 



Following a period of accelerating growth, in which the rate for motor vehicle theft in the City and County of Honolulu shot up 137.4% from 1991 to 1995, the rate declined 24.9% in 1996 and 1997, with a 12.3% drop occurring in 1997 alone. However, the 1997 rate is still the sixth highest motor vehicle theft rate in the 23 years since the beginning of statewide crime data collection in 1975. 

The arson rate in the City and County of Honolulu generally declined from 1983 to 1991 to reach its lowest point since the start of arson data collection in 1980. Since 1991, the rate has fluctuated in a narrower range, up almost 23% by 1994, then decreasing by 11.5% in 1995 and 1996, and advancing by 3.0% from 1996 to 1997. The 1997 arson rate remains 14.3% below the 15-year average of 40.5 arson offenses per 100,000 residents and 33.7% below the 1983 rate.

Fewer jurisdictions report offense data for arson than for the other Index Crimes. In cities with populations of 250,000 or more which reported arson data, the 1996 arson rate was 83.9 offenses per 100,000 residents, about 2.5 times the Honolulu rate in 1996. In cities with populations of 500,000 to 999,999 which reported arson data in 1996, the rate was 68.4 offenses per 100,000 residents, about twice the arson rate in Honolulu in 1996.



Arson of motor vehicles accounted for 49% of the number of arsons in the City and County of Honolulu in 1997 and 55% of total value loss as a result of arson, while arson of structures comprised 37% of the number of arsons and 44% of total value loss as a result of arson.

Seven arson offenses involving storage structures accounted for 10% of the total property loss and resulted in the highest average loss per offense of \$21,171. Forty-one arson offenses involving "other" property (including crops, timber, fences, signs, and merchandise stored outside structures) destroyed property worth an average of \$317 per offense, while 26 arsons against "other residential" structures (excluding single family homes, duplexes, and townhouses but including hotels) caused an average loss of \$599 per offense.



In 1997, the reported Total Index and Part II Offense rate in the City and County of Honolulu declined 4.3% from 1996 and 15.2% from 1995's highest point in the past 15 years to reach the lowest point since 1985. Following a steady rise of 21.5% from 1985's 15-year minimum to 1989's second highest point in the past 15 years, the Total Index and Part II Offense rate fluctuated in a slightly narrower, somewhat higher range from 1990-1996. The 1997 rate is 7.6% below the 15-year average of 15,608.0 offenses per 100,000 residents but 0.8% above the 1983 rate.

The percentage of Total Index and Part II Offenses cleared in the City and County of Honolulu increased by 4.8 percentage points from 1996 to 1997. The total number of reported Index and Part II Offenses decreased by 5,562 (4.2%), while the total number of clearances increased by 3,690 (6.8%).

HAWAII COUNTY

HIGHLIGHTS

In 1997, 11.9% of the State's population resided in Hawaii County. During 1997, 10.2% of the State's Index Crimes, 8.6% of the violent crimes, and 10.3% of the property crimes were reported in Hawaii County. From 1996 to 1997, the number of reported Index Crimes increased 6.7%, the number of violent crimes increased 15.0%, and the number of property crimes increased 6.4%. The numbers of reported offenses in all 8 Index Crime categories increased from 1996 to 1997: murder, 13% (up by 1 offense); rape, 2% (up by 1 offense); robbery, 11% (up 7 offenses); aggravated assault, 21% (up 28 offenses); burglary, 4% (an increase of 70 offenses); larceny-theft, 7% (up 311 offenses); motor vehicle theft, 14% (up 44 offenses); and arson, 3% (up 1 offense). Reported Part II Offenses increased 4.2%, and the Index & Part II grand total increased 5.1% from 1996 to 1997.

The following table lists the actual numbers of reported offenses, excluding traffic, in Hawaii County during the past 15 years. While the population of Hawaii County increased 40% during this period, the number of Index Crimes reported rose 50%.

Until 1997, Hawaii County had 2 Uniform Crime Reporting areas: the City of Hilo (South Hilo District) and the balance of the County. The Hawaii County Police Department requested and received permission from the FBI to discontinue separate reporting for South Hilo District effective 1997.

During the first half of 1997, Hawaii County Police closed records of cases pending prosecutorial action back to 1984. The resulting number of clearances was in excess of what would normally have been expected for that period. By agreement with the Police Department, with the exception of murder and Part II clearances, only clearances of offenses reported in 1995-1997 were included in the 1997 clearance counts. Clearance rates for previous years have not been revised.



In 1997, the total Index Crime rate in Hawaii County increased 5.4% from the 1996 rate. While this is only the second increase since 1990's record high point and the 1997 rate remains 15.8% below the record high, the increase, coupled with a decrese in the crime rate experienced by Kauai County, was sufficient to allow Kauai to regain the lowest total Index Crime rate in the state. From the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975 through 1984, in 1986, and 1987, as well as in 1996, Hawaii County had the lowest Index Crime rate. The 1997 Index rate is 0.2% above the 15-year average of 5,163.7 per 100,000 residents and 7.1% above the total rate in 1983.

Crime statistics for Hawaii County are reported the the UCR Program in the population category of rural counties with a population of 25,000 or more. While Hawaii County differs from most rural counties on the mainland, especially because it encompasses two resort destination areas and can only be reached by ocean or air transportation, the rural population category assignation best fits the UCR criteria.


The total crime rate in Hawaii County was 117.4% higher than the national rate in rural areas, 2,257.4 per 100,000 in 1996, the last year for which national figures are available.



The number of murders reported in Hawaii County in 1997 increased to 9 from the 8 reported in 1996, resulting in a 12.3% rise in the murder rate. The 1997 murder rate is second highest since 1988, surpassed only by the 1995 rate. The 1997 rate is 10.3% above the 15-year average of 5.8 murders per 100,000 residents and 28.0% higher than the rate in 1983.

Of the 9 murder victims in Hawaii County in 1997, 5 (55.6%) were shot with firearms, 3 with handguns and 2 with rifles, 2 (22.2%) were stabbed with knives, 1 (11.1%) was beaten with a blunt instrument, and 1 was beaten with hands, fists, feet, etc. (strongarm murder).





The robbery rate in Hawaii County increased 10.1% from 1996 to 1997, erasing more than half of the 16.0% decline recorded from 1995 to 1996. 





For the first half of the year, the clearance count was modified due to the administrative closing of a large backlog of cases which had been kept open pending prosecutorial decision.









Arson of structures accounted for 57% of the number of arsons in Hawaii County in 1997 and 84% of total value loss as a result of arson. Seven arson offenses involving "other commercial" (excluding industrial and manufacturing) structures accounted for over 60% of the total property loss and resulted in the highest average loss per offense of \$49,643.

Three arson offenses involving "community/public" structures averaged damages of \$92 per offense, while 4 arsons against all other structures resulted in an average loss of \$700.



MAUI COUNTY

HIGHLIGHTS

In 1997, 10.0% of the State's residents lived in Maui County. During 1997, 11.1% of the State's total Index Crimes, 9.8% of the violent crimes, and 11.1% of the property crimes were reported in Maui County. From 1996 to 1997, the total numbers of reported Index Crimes and property crimes in Maui County decreased 1.9% and 2.7%, respectively, while violent crimes rose by 21.5%. The numbers of offenses in 7 of the 8 Index Crime categories increased from 1996 to 1997, but larceny-thefts decreased by 6% (369 offenses), more than enough to offset the total increases in the other Index and property offenses. The increases were in murder: 200% (up by 2 offenses), rape: 26% (10 offenses), robbery: 2% (2 offenses), aggravated assault: 38% (43 offenses), burglary: 7% (107 offenses), motor vehicle theft: 13% (51 offenses), and arson: 131% (21 offenses). Reported Part II Offenses increased 4.1%, and the Index and Part II grand total rose 2.7% from 1996 to 1997.

The table below lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Maui County from 1983 to 1997. During the past 15 years, the population of Maui County increased 48% while the number of reported Index Crimes increased 31%.



While the total crime rate in Maui County decreased 3.2% from 1996 to 1997, the decrease was solely due a reduction in the number of reported larceny-thefts. Each of the other 7 Index Crimes saw an increase in the number and rate of offenses. The 1997 total crime rate is the lowest crime rate since 1991, 6.4% below the 15-year average of 7,114.7 offenses per 100,000 residents, and 11.6% below the rate in 1983.

Crime statistics for Maui County are reported to the UCR Program in the population category which includes rural counties with a population of 25,000 or more. While Maui County differs from most rural counties on the mainland, especially in terms of population density, the rural population category assignation best fits the UCR criteria.



Violent offenses accounted for 4.1% of the Index Crimes reported in Maui County in 1997. After peaking in 1987, the violent crime rate declined approximately 50% through 1993 to reach the 15-year minimum. From 1993 to 1997, the violent crime rate increased steadily, by 45.8%, to a level that is 2.5% above the 15-year average of 264.4 violent offenses per 100,000 residents and 6.4% above the 1983 violent crime rate. In 1997 alone, the rate increased 20.0%.

Some of the magnitude of the increases and decreases in the violent crime rate in the late 1980's and 1990 may be due in part to one or more changes in the Maui Police Department's definition of aggravated assault. In late 1990, the Department reclassified many aggravated assaults reported in the previous few months, indicating that the definition which had been in use was not appropriately restrictive; that is, offenses which should have remained in the simple assault category had been incorrectly designated as aggravated assaults. The Department was not able to unfound aggravated assaults which may have been incorrectly classified prior to mid-1990.



Although murders tripled from 1 to 3 in 1997 from 1996, almost tripling the murder rate, the 1997 murder rate is 26.5% lower than the 15-year average of 3.4 murders per 100,000 residents and 50.0% lower than the murder rate in 1983. 



In 1997, for the second consecutive year, the robbery rate in Maui County stood at a record high since the start of statewide data collection in 1975, increasing just 0.5% from 1996 but up 54.4% since the beginning of a steady rise in 1993. In fact, all of the rates from the past 6 years exceed all of the rates from the previous 9 years. The 1997 robbery rate is 51.2% above the 15-year average robbery rate of 62.9 offenses per 100,000 residents and 62.0% above the 1983 rate. By comparison, Maui County's 1997 robbery rate was just over two-thirds as high as Honolulu's rate, but almost twice as high as Hawaii County's rate and 7 times the Kauai rate.

Of the 113 robberies committed in Maui County in 1997, 20.4% involved a firearm, 12.4% a knife/cutting instrument, 8.8% another dangerous weapon, and 58.4% strongarm methods (hands, fists, feet, etc.).



During the past 15 years, Maui County has experienced 3 strong trends for aggravated assault: from 1983 to 1987, when the aggravated assault rate increased 79.1%; from 1987 to 1993, when the rate decreased 72.7% to reach its lowest point since 1975, and from 1993 to 1997, when the rate again increased, this time by 65.5%. From 1993 to 1996, the rate increased just 21.8%, and all of the rates in this period were lower than those from 1977 to 1992. Some of the magnitude of the changes in the late 1980's and 1990 may be due to one or more changes in the Maui Police Department's definition of aggravated assault. The increase in the aggravated assault rate from 1996 to 1997 was 35.9%. The 1997 rate is 19.6% below the 15-year average of 164.4 offenses per 100,000 residents and 19.2% below the 1983 rate.

Of the 157 reported aggravated assaults in Maui County in 1997, 5.7% involved a firearm, 15.9% a knife or cutting instrument, 37.6% other dangerous weapons, and 40.8% strongarm methods (hands, fists, feet, etc.).











The arson rate in Maui County more than doubled in 1997, increasing by 128.7% from 1996's record low since the start of arson offense reporting in 1980. The 15-year average arson rate, 39.7 offenses per 100,000 residents, is 27.7% above the 1997 rate, and arson rates have generally declined since 1980's record high rate of 99.2. However, the 1997 rate is 31.2% higher than the arson rate in 1983, which was the third lowest rate in the past 15 years.



Arson of structures accounted for 35% of the number of arsons in Maui County in 1997 and 65% of the value of property destroyed by arson.

The highest average loss due to arson occurred in single occupancy residential structures: \$33,750. 

HIGHLIGHTS

In 1997, 4.8% of the State's population resided in Kauai County. During 1997, 4.0% of State's Index Crimes, 1.7% of the violent crimes, and 4.1% of the property crimes were reported in Kauai County.

From 1996 to 1997, the total numbers of reported Index Crimes and property crimes decreased, 4.3% and 4.2%, respectively, while reported violent crimes decreased by 8.1% in Kauai County. Three of the 4 categories of violent crime had fewer reported offenses in 1997 than in 1996: murder was down by 75% (3 offenses), forcible rape by 5% (1 offense), and robbery by 38% (5 offenses). Also decreasing were 3 of the 4 categories of reported property crime: larceny-thefts moved down 8% (174 offenses, motor vehicle thefts were off 4% (3 offenses), and arsons fell 40% (4 offenses), from 1996 to 1997. Aggravated assaults increased 16% (4 offenses) and burglaries were up 9% (54 offenses) over the year. Reported Part II Offenses declined 15.7%, and the Index and Part II grand total retreated 11.5% from 1996 to 1997.

The table below lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Kauai County from 1983 to 1997. During the past 15 years, the population of Kauai County increased 32%. During the same period, the number of reported Index Crimes increased 24%.



The 1997 total crime rate in Kauai County was reduced by 4.0% from 1996 but remains 18.6% above the 1994 minimum since the start of statewide data collection in 1975. The total crime rate in 1997 is 2.3% above the 15-year average of 4,933.9 Index Offenses per 100,000 residents and 6.2% below the 1983 total rate. In 1985, from 1988 through 1995, and again in 1997, Kauai County had the lowest crime rate in the State of Hawaii. In 1996, Hawaii County claimed that distinction. In 1997, Kauai's rate was 2.4% lower than second place Hawaii County's rate.

Crime statistics for Kauai County are reported by the UCR Program in the population category which is comprised of rural counties with populations of 25,000 or more. While Kauai County differs from most rural counties on the mainland, especially in terms of population density, the rural population category assignation best fits the UCR criteria.


Kauai County's total crime rate exceeded the total rate in rural counties across the nation in 1996. The average rate in rural counties was 2,257.4 offenses per 100,000 residents, 57.1% lower than in Kauai County in 1996.

Violent crimes comprised 2.0% of the Index Crimes reported to Kauai Police in 1997. The violent crime rate decreased 7.8% from 1996 to 1997 to post its third record low in the past 4 years, since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975. During the past 4 years, Kauai County has enjoyed the lowest violent crime rate in the state. The 1997 violent rate is 40.4% below the 15-year average of 169.4 violent offenses per 100,000 residents and 54.0% below the rate set in 1983.



The wild fluctuations in the murder rate in Kauai County result from the small numbers of murders that occur. Since 1983, there have been 2 years in which no murders were reported in Kauai County. The 4 murders reported in 1996 are the most known in any year since 1978. The decrease to a single murder in 1997 reduced the murder rate by 74.6%. The 1997 murder rate in Kauai County is half the 15-year average of 3.6 murders per 100,000 residents and 74.3% below the 1983 rate.

The sole reported murder victim in Kauai County in 1997 was beaten to death by physical force (strongarm).





The robbery rate in Kauai County has also fluctuated a great deal over the past 15 years. In 1997 the robbery rate declined for the third consecutive year, down 38.3% from 1996 and 56.2% from 1994. 

The aggravated assault rate in Kauai County has moved steeply downward since the 1975 start of statewide data collection, when a rate of 248.5 assaults per 100,000 population was posted. In 1997, the aggravated assault rate rose 16.3% from 1996's third consecutive record low to post its fourth lowest level since 1975. 



The 15-year trend of burglary rates in Kauai County shows a sharp decline in the number of burglaries per 100,000 residents to reach consecutive low points in 1993 and 1994 followed by a 3-year steady increase. 

In 1997, larceny-theft offenses accounted for 72.6% of the Crime Index and 74.1% of the property offenses reported in Kauai County. Following four years of steady decline to set a 15-year minimum in 1993, the larceny-theft rate rose steadily from 1993 to 1996 to reach its 15-year peak. In 1997 the rate decreased 7.5% from the 1996 peak. The 1997 larceny rate is 8.0% above the 15-year average of 3,392.7 offenses per 100,000 residents and 0.02% below the 1983 rate.



The rate of motor vehicle theft in Kauai County was reduced by 3.3% from 1996 to 1997 to reach its lowest level since the 1975 start of statewide crime data collection. Indeed, 3 of the past 4 years experienced the lowest motor vehicle theft rates on record, while the 1995 rate was the sixth lowest. The 1997 rate is 31.6% below the 15-year average of 207.3 thefts per 100,000 residents and 9.4% below the rate in 1983.

Rural counties nationwide had a 5.7% lower motor vehicle theft rate than Kauai County in 1996, with 138.3 thefts per 100,000 residents.



In 1997, the arson rate in Kauai County decreased 40.1% from 1996 and 70.4% from 1995's second highest rate since the start of arson data collection to place second lowest since 1980. The 1997 arson rate is 52.3% below the 15-year average of 22.2 per 100,000 residents and 35.4% below the rate in 1983.

Fewer jurisdictions report offense data for arson than for the other Index Crimes. In those rural counties reporting arson offenses, the 1996 rate of 18.9 arsons per 100,000 residents was 6.8% higher than the 1996 rate in Kauai County.

Erratum for 1996: clearance rates published for arson offenses in Kauai County in *Crime in Hawaii, 1996* in the above section were displaced from the correct clearance rates by 1 year, i.e., 1984 incorrectly showed 0.0 percent cleared, 1985 showed 41.7 percent cleared, etc.



There were no arsons of structures reported to police in Kauai County in 1997. Of the 2 categories with losses reported, motor vehicles had the higher average loss, \$11,700 per offense, and accounted for 81% of the total value loss as a result of arson. Arson of other property (including crops, timber, fences, signs, and merchandise stored outside structures) accounted for 67% of the number of arsons and resulted in an average loss of \$1,350 per offense.


The reported Part II Offense rate in Kauai County fell 15.5% from 1996 to 1997 to reach its lowest point since 1984. Following an increasing trend from 1983 to 1990, the Part II Offense rate has, with considerable fluctuation, trended downward. The 1997 rate is 25.5% below the 1990, 15-year high point and 11.2% below the 15-year average of 8,623.2 offenses per 100,000 residents. In 1997, the reported Total Index and Part II Offense rate fell 12.3% from 1996 to reach to its lowest level since 1984 and the third lowest point in the past 15 years. From 1984's lowest rate in the past 15 years, to the 15-year peak in 1990, the grand total offense rate in Kauai County steadily increased. From 1990 to 1992, the rate declined by 15.8%, then fluctuated through 1996. The percentage of Total Index and Part II Offenses cleared in Kauai County decreased by 2.2 percentage points from 1996 to 1997. The total number of reported Index and Part II Offenses decreased by 933 (11.5%), while the total number of clearances decreased by 441 (17.9%).

ARREST STATISTICS

Arrest data, including the age, sex, and race/ethnicity of the arrestees, are reported by county law enforcement agencies for all violations except most traffic offenses. Contrary to the rule in which offenses of negligent manslaughter are tallied for nontraffic cases only, arrest totals for this offense include both traffic and nontraffic cases. The UCR Program requires that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. As such, arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses.

The most severe violation is recorded for each arrest. The violations are divided into two categories: Index Offenses, including murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; and Part II Offenses, comprised of manslaughter by negligence¹ and all other offenses. Definitions of Index Crimes and Part II Offenses are included in Appendices A and B, respectively.

Race and ethnicity data are presented using categories specific to Hawaii: White (Caucasian), Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Hawaiian/Part-Hawaiian, Korean, Samoan, and Other Asian or Pacific Islanders. Categories typically employed elsewhere in the nation are more restrictive: White (Caucasian), Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, and Asian or Pacific Islander.

There were a number of new tables introduced in *Crime in Hawaii*, 1996. Primary among these were historical counts of adult and juvenile arrests for the Part II Offense categories. The juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway are traditionally included in Part II. Arrests in these categories account for a substantial portion of the Part II and total Index & Part II juvenile arrests. Because these categories do not exist for adults, any adult-to-juvenile comparison based on traditional Part II totals will be biased in favor of adults. The tables on pages 108 and 116, and the applicable charts on pages 111, 112, and 116 have dealt with this shortcoming either by reporting these status offense arrests separately from other Part II Offense arrests or by ignoring these arrests when charting Part II Offense arrests. Due to space limitations, similar handling was not possible in the 15-year historical tables.

Also, the role that status offenses play in any examination of juvenile arrest trends should be considered. For example, in 1983, there were 1,571 arrests statewide for the specified status offenses, accounting for 25% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses. In 1997, 5,273 statewide status offense arrests were tallied, accounting for 42% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses.

¹ The division of crime categories is often made between Part I, which is comprised of Index Offenses plus manslaughter by negligence, and Part II, which includes all other offenses. The sections on reported offenses (pages 4-105) and arrests (pages 107-166) include manslaughter by negligence with the Part II Offenses for two reasons: 1) the UCR Program, and this report, emphasize Index Offenses (which exclude manslaughter by negligence) rather than Part II Offenses; and 2) the national report, *Crime in the United States*, groups arrest data by Index Offenses and all other offenses; no arrest data are reported for manslaughter by negligence.




Adults accounted for 73% of all arrests in both the past 15 years and the most recent 5 years. Adults also increased their share of total Index Crime arrests from 58% in the ten years from 1983-1992 to 65% in the most recent 5 years, 1993-1997. Meanwhile, the adult share of violent crime arrests decreased from 79% in 1983-1992 to 74% in 1993-1997. In the 1983-1992 period, 56% of those arrested for property crimes were adults, while the adult share of arrests for property crimes was up to 64% in the most recent 5 years. Juveniles accounted for the majority of the arrests for burglary (51%), motor vehicle theft (50.5%), and arson (56%) in the ten years from 1983-1992. In the 1993-1997 period, the juvenile share of burglary arrests fell to 39% but plummeted to 28% of motor vehicle theft arrests. Arrests for arson totaled 127 adults and 125 juveniles.



State of Hawaii 15-Year Arrrest Rate Charts and Total Arrests Table



15-Year Arrest Rate Charts for Adults and Juveniles











A comparison of the rate per 100,000 population "at risk" for arrest as an adult to the respective rate for arrest as a juvenile encounters two major inequities: 1) status offense arrests affect only juveniles and 2) while the youngest children are counted in the juvenile population, they are not at risk for arrest. On the next two pages, a more realistic picture of the difference in arrest rates between adults and juveniles is developed.


The charts on this page show the results of improving the last chart on the previous page to respond to just one of the previously mentioned objections at a time. The last chart on page 112 incorporates an attempt to deal with both of these shortcomings. When arrests for the specified juvenile status offenses are removed from the arrest counts, the picture becomes as follows:

Without an adjustment for status offense arrests, but with younger children excluded from the population at risk, the following chart depicts the rates just for juveniles 10-17 years of age, who accounted for 98.7% of all juvenile arrests in the past 15 years and 99.3% of the arrests in 1997.

There is also a large portion of the adult population which is at very low risk of arrest. However, adult arrests dwindle with age more slowly than juvenile arrests accelerate as children approach adolescence. In 1997, total arrests in the 35-39 year age group numbered 9,034, slightly below the peak 30-34 year-old group, in which 9,919 arrests were recorded. The 40-44 year group encompassed 5,976 arrests, while the 45-49 group included only 3,423 arrests, down 65.5% from the peak. It was decided to draw the line at age 44, which placed 87.7% of 1997's adult arrests in the arrest-prone group. The entire arrest-prone group, ages 10-44 inclusive, represented 50.8% of the state's resident population in 1997 but accounted for 90.5% of 1997's arrests. Population estimates by single year of age for the past 15 years were provided by the Bureau of the Census through the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism.

15-Year Arrest Rate Charts for Ages Most Criminally At-Risk





Males accounted for 74% of adult arrests for Index Crimes in the State of Hawaii in 1997. For 5 of the 8 Index Offenses, males were apprehended over 80% of the time. Females accounted for 40% of the arrests for arson, 32% of the arrests for larceny, and 22% of the arrests for motor vehicle theft.

Males also accounted for the majority of arrests in each adult age category. The overall proportion of males to females arrested in 1997 is similar to 1996. For the third consecutive year, males slightly decreased their share of arrests for Index Offenses.

Overall, the number of adult arrests for Index Offenses increased 3.9% from 1996 to 1997, resuming the rise which occurred from 1991 to 1995, but remaining slightly below the number arrested in 1994.

Among adults, more Whites were arrested for Index Offenses in the State of Hawaii in 1997 than individuals of any other race: 36% of the total. Whites comprise approximately 22% of the State's population according to a Health Surveillance Program survey of 9,205 noninstitutionalized persons conducted in 1996. Blacks, who account for an estimated 1.4% of the State's population, were disproportionately represented in 7 of the 8 adult arrest categories. Chinese and Japanese adults were arrested at a lower rate than their proportions of the State's estimated population: 3.1, and 20.3%, respectively. Native Americans (Indians) were not specifically identified in the 1996 population survey, but, according to the 1990 census, they represented 0.5% of the State's population, and should therefore be among those races that are arrested at less than the overall crime rate.

Filipinos, who were estimated to have made up 10.0% of Hawaii's population in 1996, were overrepresented in adult arrests for all Index Offense categories except arson. Hawaiians and part-Hawaiians, estimated at 20.6% of the State's population, were overrepresented in all adult Index arrest categories except forcible rape, larceny-theft, and arson. Koreans were estimated at 0.8% of Hawaii's population in 1996 but accounted for 1.2% of adult arrests in 1997. Samoans were arrested more often for each Index Offense except arson than one might expect based on the proportion of Samoans estimated in the population: 0.8% in 1996.

Racial/ethnic groups changing 2.0 or more percentage points in their share of adult arrests for Index Offenses since 1995 are Filipinos, up 2.5 percentage points and 'Other' (reported to the FBI as unspecified Asian/Pacific Islanders), down 2.5 percentage points.

No juveniles were arrested for murder in the State of Hawaii in 1997, the only time this has happened in the past 15 years. Males accounted for 70% of the juvenile arrests for Index Crimes in the State of Hawaii in 1997. For 5 of the 7 categories in which offenses were reported, males comprised at least 85% of the arrestees. The two exceptions were larceny-theft and motor vehicle theft, in which females accounted for 36% and 31% of the arrests, respectively.

Males also accounted for the majority of arrests in each juvenile age category. Females comprised 38% of the arrestees in the 10 to 12 year old category and 33% of the 13 to 14 year old category.

Overall, the number of juvenile arrests for Index Offenses decreased 4.5% from 1996 to 1997, resuming the decline which had occurred from 1992 through 1995. The 1997 total is 15% below the 1992 total but remains 5% above 1995's total.

Females decreased their share of juvenile arrests for Index Offenses from 34% in 1996 to 30% in 1997. The share of juvenile arrests represented by females had grown steadily from 23% in 1991 to 34% in 1994 prior to fluctuating down to 32% in 1995 and back up to 34% in 1996.

The 3 tables in this packet were withheld from publication in *Crime in Hawaii*, 1997 because the original compilations showed close to a 50% reduction in the percentage of juvenile arrests accounted for by Hawaiians/Part Hawaiians, together with offsetting increases in several other racial/ethnic groups. It was found that, effective February, 1997, the race/ethnicity of juveniles arrested in the City and County of Honolulu was being assigned from the juvenile history record of the new Juvenile Justice Information System (JJIS). Previously, Honolulu Police Department data entry personnel had chosen 1 of generally 2 ethnicities written on the crime incident report to be the race/ethnicity reported to UCR.

The goal of ethnicity reporting with regard to Hawaiians is to record "Hawaiian/Part Hawaiian" if any Hawaiian ancestry is present. Thus, if "Hawaiian" appeared on the incident report, "Hawaiian/Part Hawaiian" was chosen for UCR. While the JJIS juvenile history record has spaces for up to 5 races/ethnicities, the city computer was programmed to exclusively select the first-listed ethnicity for UCR. For the tables included in this packet, the computer was reprogrammed to choose "Hawaiian/Part Hawaiian" if Hawaiian appeared in any of the 5 ethnicity fields. Because the overall results are in close agreement with those obtained in 1996, this method will continue to be used in the future, eventually for all counties.

The largest change in the distribution of juvenile arrests for Index Offenses by race/ethnicity from 1996 to 1997 is a decrease in the "Other" category from 12.2% to 6.8%, coupled with smaller significant increases in the Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Hawaiian, and Samoan groups. There was no change in the share represented by Whites. The increased reporting in specific race/ethnic groups confirms the value of using the juvenile record, rather than data collected during the current arrest only, to assign race/ethnicity for UCR.





15-Year Arrrest Rate Charts and Total Arrests Table


Arrest Rates per 100,000 Residents




NOTE: The Honolulu Police Department's crime incident file is continuously updated to reflect changes in arrest charges and add data which were missed at the time of an arrest. By late September, 1998, when the incident file was accessed to provide the offense breakdown for this corrected table, 0.7% more records had been added for 1997 than were originally reported to UCR. The excess counts were removed by ratio and proportion, returning the total for each offense to the total previously reported for the age and sex breakdown. The maximum adjustments in percentage terms reduced 14 arrests which were reported in each of 2 categories, forcible rape and gambling, to the originally reported 10 arrests in each category. In terms of numbers, the largest adjustments were to decrease the larceny-theft arrest count by 57, from 2,088 to 2,031 and increase the runaway count by 36, from 3,777 to 3,813.

Hawaii County 15-Year Arrrest Rate Charts and Total Arrests Table


Arrest Rates per 100,000 Residents







Maui County 15-Year Arrrest Rate Charts and Total Arrests Table


Arrest Rates per 100,000 Residents






Arrest Rates per 100,000 Residents

APPENDIX A

DEFINITIONS

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury; attempted murder. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed. Attacks by personal weapons, such as hands, fists, feet, etc., which result in serious or aggravated injury.

ARSON: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

ASSAULT: an unlawful attack by one person upon another. Includes Aggravated Assault (Part I Offense) and Other Assaults (Part II Offense).

BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry where no entry occurs.

CLEARANCE: An offense is "cleared" either by arrest or exceptional means. An offense is cleared by arrest when at least one person is arrested; charged with the commission of the offense; and turned over to the court for prosecution. An offense is cleared by exceptional means when the identity of the offender is known; there is enough evidence to support an arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution; the exact location of the offender is known; and, for reasons outside the control of law enforcement, the offender cannot be arrested, charged, and prosecuted. Examples of offenses cleared by exceptional means include suicide of the offender, double murder, deathbed confession, and denied extradition. It should be noted that the number of offenses and not the number of persons arrested is used to count clearances. Several offenses may be cleared by the arrest of one person; or the arrest of several people may clear only one offense.

CRIME INDEX: The eight Part I Offenses reported in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program to represent the status of crime in the United States: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

CRIME RATE: The number of crimes per 100,000 population (usually the resident population): Crime Rate = Number of Crimes x 100,000

Resident Population

More accurate crime rates (e.g., the number of rapes per 100,000 females or the number of motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 vehicles) are not reported in *Crime in the U.S.* and, therefore, are not used in *Crime in Hawaii*.

CRIMINAL HOMICIDE: The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another or the killing of another person through gross negligence. Includes Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), and Manslaughter by Negligence.

DE FACTO POPULATION: The number of persons physically present in an area, regardless of military status or usual place of residence. Includes visitors present and excludes residents temporarily absent.

FORCIBLE RAPE: The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included. Statutory rape (without force), any sexual assaults against males, and other sex offenses are not included in this category.

JUVENILE: Person under the age of 18.

LARCENY-THEFT: The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Includes pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, theft from motor vehicles, theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, etc. Does not include embezzlement, forgery, or motor vehicle theft.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

MURDER: The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another.

NONVIOLENT OFFENSES: Include the offense categories of larceny-theft, burglary, and auto theft. Often referred to as Property Offenses (excluding robbery).

PART I OFFENSES: Offenses which make up the Crime Index: murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; plus the offense of manslaughter by negligence.

PART II OFFENSES: All criminal offenses not classified as Part I Offenses. Also included are the juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway. See Appendix B for specific Part II Offense definitions.

PROPERTY OFFENSES: Include larceny-theft, burglary, auto theft, and arson. Robbery is classified as a violent crime due to the use or threat of force.

RESIDENT POPULATION: The number of persons whose usual place of residence is in an area, regardless of physical location on the estimated census date. Includes military personnel stationed or homeported in the area and excludes persons of local origin attending school or in military service outside the area.

ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim(s) in fear. While robbery has the attributes of a property crime, it is grouped with violent crimes due to the additional attribute of force or the threat of force.

VIOLENT OFFENSES: Include the offense categories of murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

APPENDIX B

DEFINITIONS: PART II OFFENSES

CRIMINAL OFFENSES

ASSAULT, OTHER: Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim. Examples include simple assault; assault and battery; resisting or obstructing an officer; intimidation; coercion; and hazing.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; and blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of intoxicants.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS: Include all violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of illegal drugs.

EMBEZZLEMENT: Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING: All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possession of, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of what is true.

FRAUD: Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks (except forgeries and counterfeiting), confidence games, and unauthorized withdrawal of money from an automatic teller machine.

GAMBLING: Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling. Includes 3 subcategories: bookmaking, numbers and lottery, and "other" gambling.

LIQUOR LAWS: Include unlawful manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor; and drinking on a train or public conveyance. Do not include Drunkenness and Driving Under the Influence.

MANSLAUGHTER BY NEGLIGENCE: The killing of another person through gross negligence. Manslaughter by negligence is considered a Part I Offense, but is not included in the Crime Index.

OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN: Include all charges of nonsupport, and neglect or abuse of family and children. Examples include desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and nonpayment of alimony.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE: Sex offenses of a commercialized nature. Include prostitution; keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame; pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.; and all attempts.

SEX OFFENSES: Include indecent exposure, incest, statutory rape (no force), any sexual assaults against males, other offenses against common decency and morals, and all attempts. Do not include forcible rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice.

STOLEN PROPERTY: Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, including attempts.

VAGRANCY: Persons arrested on grounds of "suspicion" may be prosecuted on this charge. Includes vagrancy, begging, loitering (persons 18 and over), and vagabondage.

VANDALISM: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

WEAPONS OFFENSES: Include unlawful manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; unlawful carrying of deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc. silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to a minor; and all attempts to commit any of the above.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES: Include all other state and local offenses (excluding traffic violations) not included elsewhere. Examples are:

Admitting minors to improper places

Abduction and compelling to marry

Bigamy and polygamy

Blackmail and extortion

Combination in restraint of trade; trusts, monopolies

Contempt of court

Criminal anarchism

Discrimination, unfair competition

Kidnaping

Marriage within prohibited degrees

Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency, such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices

Perjury and subornation of perjury

Possession, repair, manufacture, etc. of burglar's tools

Possession of drug paraphernalia

Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.

Public nuisances

Riot and rout

Trespass

Unlawfully bringing drugs and liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to convicts

Violations of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances

Violation of quarantine

Truancy (noncriminal juvenile status offense)

Ungovernability (noncriminal juvenile status offense)

All offenses not otherwise classified

All attempts to commit any of the above

NONCRIMINAL OFFENSES

STATUS OFFENSES (PERSONS UNDER 18): Noncriminal acts or conduct which are offenses only when committed or engaged in by juveniles; include curfew violation and runaways.

CURFEW AND LOITERING: Included are violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

RUNAWAYS: Apprehension for protective custody as defined by local statute.


NONCRIMINAL ARREST CATEGORY

SUSPICION: While "suspicion" is not an offense, it may be the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by the police.

APPENDIX C

POLICE OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED, AND POLICE DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEE STATISTICS

Police Officers Assaulted State of Hawaii 1983-1997



The graph above shows the trend for the number of police officers assaulted during the past 15 years. From 1983 to 1997, the number of assaults on police officers decreased 39.4% from 592 in 1983 to 359 in 1997. The 15-year trend was at its highest point in 1983 and declined for the second consecutive year in 1997 to sink below the previous 15-year minimum of 378 assaults reported in 1989. The 1997 assault total was the lowest since 1978. From 1996 to 1997 the number of police officers assaulted decreased 10.9%, from 403 in 1996 to 1997's 359.


By county, assaults on officers in 1997 were distributed 79.1% (284) to Honolulu, 10.0% (36) to Hawaii County, and 10.9% (39) to Maui County. There were no assaults against officers of the Kauai Police Department in 1997.

As in all of the other years since 1978, most of the assaults on police officers during 1997 occurred when responding to disturbance calls (207, 57.7%). Police officers attempting an arrest comprised the next most likely group to be targeted for assaults in 1997 (59, 16.4%). The percentage of assaulted officers who were handling/transporting prisoners fell from 9.7% in 1996 to 6.4% in 1997. Traffic pursuits and the investigation of suspicious persons each accounted for less than 6% of the total. Attacks on officers on other, unspecified, assignments increased from 4.2% of the total assaults in 1996 to 7.2% in 1997.

Physical force was the most typical means of assault. Ninety-one percent (328) of the officers assaulted in 1997 were assaulted by hands, fists, or other bodily means. This trend is similar

to that of the Pacific States¹ where most of the assaults on police officers were by "personal weapon," 82% in 1996. The bar graphs below show the breakdown of weapons used in assaults and the type of assignment local police officers were on when they were assaulted.

Law Enforcement Officers Assaulted State of Hawaii, 1997




On October 31, 1997, 2,645 full-time police officers were employed by the county police departments. Therefore the 359 assaults on officers in 1997 produced an assault rate of 13.6 attacks per 100 officers statewide for 1997. In 1996, the latest year for which national data are available, the assault rate for the State was higher than the rate for the Pacific States: 15.6 versus 11.9 attacks per 100 officers, respectively.



During 1997, 35% (124) of all assaults on police officers occurred between 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. and 58% (209) occurred between 8:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. Data on the number of police officers assaulted per 100 full-time officers and the time of assaults are shown below.

APPENDIX D

POPULATION ESTIMATES

State and county resident population estimates for *Crime in Hawaii 1997* were provided by the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT). In addition, revised DBEDT population figures for 1990-1996 were used to calculate crime rates. As a result, the rates for these years differ from those published in *Crime in Hawaii 1996*; however, all changes differ by less than 1% from previously published rates.

The United States census of population is taken as of April 1 in each year ending in zero. Intercensal population estimates are made as of July 1 in each noncensus year. Estimates based on the just completed census are also made for July 1 of census years. While the FBI continues to use exact census populations to calculate crime rates in census years, *Crime in Hawaii 1997* used July 1 estimated populations to determine crime rates for all years. In so doing, a regular progression of estimates taken at 12-month intervals is available to more accurately reflect crime rate trends.
