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Foreword

Crime in Hawaii 1999 is a comprehensive report of the nature and extent of crime in our state. The report is based upon the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program's monthly offense and arrest reports that are voluntarily submitted by the four county police departments to the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division of the Department of the Attorney General. We then forward the reports to the FBI. The compilation of these data would not be possible without the cooperation and support of Chief Wayne Carvalho (ret.) of the Hawaii County Police Department, Chief Lee Donohue of the City & County of Honolulu Police Department, Chief George Freitas of the Kauai County Police Department, and Chief Thomas Phillips of the Maui County Police Department. Special thanks go to the UCR data collection and records personnel in each of the counties: Cynthia Edralin in Kauai County, Nathan Matsuoka in Honolulu, Lynn Peters and Greer Jones in Maui County, and Flora Yamanaka on the Big Island of Hawaii. Much of what we know about crime in our state is due to the efforts of these county law enforcement agencies.

Undoubtedly, 1999 was an important year for crime in Hawaii. The Index Crime rate fell 9.5% in 1999, yielding a four-year decrease of 33.2% and reaching its lowest level in the 25-year history of statewide crime reporting. Readers will observe many other record and near-record lows at both the state and county levels highlighted throughout the report. That it was only four years earlier, in 1995, that crime in Hawaii was approaching a record high level suggests how truly remarkable the 1999 statistics are.

We regret the relative tardiness of this year's publication. Unfortunate personal circumstances resulted in extended leaves of absence for two key staff members, delaying publication for several months. This delay was especially disadvantageous given that 1999 was such a noteworthy year for crime in Hawaii.

One positive result of our attempt to complete *Crime in Hawaii 1999* is a major improvement to its layout. We have made the data easier to review through the use of bolder graphics and streamlined narratives, while other significant, and sometimes subtle improvements have been made throughout the entire report. We will make additional refinements in next year's edition.

Crime is an important concern of the citizens of Hawaii. An accurate view of the nature and extent of crime is vital to both understanding the problems associated with crime and developing solutions to those problems. Given the perpetual debate over the allocation of scarce federal, state, and local resources, objective information plays a critical role in deciding how we address crime in our communities.

Caveats

Statistical crime reporting requires a number of rules to count events consistently. Multiple offenses may be committed in most opportunities for crime, and multiple charges may be attached to a single arrest. The statistics presented in this report were collected and compiled using the FBI's Hierarchy Rule that limits crime counts to only the most serious offense committed within an incident that is constrained by time and place, and limits arrest counts to only the most serious charge per booking. Therefore, some crimes may be underreported, e.g., if the victim is killed in a single-victim robbery situation, only murder is recorded, not the crime of robbery. Further details of the Hierarchy Rule are discussed in Footnote 1 on page 2.

The number of reported offenses corresponds to a victim count for only some types of offenses. Violent crimes generally employ the total victim count. Robberies, however, are counted by the incident, regardless of the number of victims. Property crimes also are generally counted by the incident, with the notable exceptions that a burglary is counted for each structure entered, and a motor vehicle theft for each vehicle stolen.

Some crimes are inherently difficult to classify. The UCR definition of aggravated assault, for example, is complex and has been misinterpreted, resulting in large variations between agencies and between years.

These statistics were produced from the operations of Hawaii's 4 county police departments. Statistics of prosecutorial, court, and parole board decisions are reported separately, by those agencies.

It is strongly cautioned that year-to-year changes based on small numbers of events are likely to result in large percentage changes which typically are not as meaningful as they might appear at first glance.

An unappreciated difference in the time period covered by two different sets of statistics can lead to erroneous conclusions regarding underlying relationships. For example, an abrupt change in the "percent of offenses cleared" statistics, which link the volume of arrests to the volume of reported offenses, should be viewed with caution because offenses already reported in previous years may be counted as cleared, by arrest or exceptional means, in the current year. A clearance is further defined in Appendix A.

The distinction between resident and de facto population is a most important consideration in viewing *Crime in Hawaii*. Crime rates are based on the number of crimes per 100,000 residents. De facto population includes the number of persons physically present in the state: residents, tourists, and non-resident military personnel. Crime rates based on de facto population can be significantly different than rates based on resident population. The UCR program uses resident population to calculate crime rates for all states. However, because of Hawaii's relatively small resident population and large visitor population, crime rates based on resident population are much higher when compared to rates based on the actual number of people in the state.

These and other issues surrounding the collection and compilation of crime and arrest data can contribute to the misinterpretation of statistics presented in this report. 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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The nature and extent of crime in Hawaii are atypical compared to many other parts of the United States. Nationally, 88% of the Index Crimes in 1999 were property crimes; 12% were violent crimes. In Hawaii, 95% of the Index Crimes in 1999 were property crimes and only 5% were violent crimes.

Preliminary national findings from the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program indicate that the number of reported Crime Index Offenses decreased 7% from 1998 to 1999, while in Hawaii the number of Crime Index Offenses decreased 10%. Nationally, violent crimes and property crimes both decreased 7%; in Hawaii, the number of violent crimes decreased 5% and property crimes decreased 10%.

In 1998, Hawaii was ranked 41st among the 50 states on the basis of resident population, 12th for total Index Crime rate per 100,000 residents, 44th for violent Index Crime rate, and 8th for property Index Crime rate

In 1998, Hawaii ranked 45th in the nation per 100,000 resident population for reported murders, 34th for forcible rapes, 28th for robberies, and 44th for aggravated assaults among the 50 states. In property crimes, Hawaii ranked 15th for burglaries, 7th for larceny-thefts, and 14th for motor vehicle thefts.

In addition to those mentioned above, highlights of this report include the following:

- Hawaii's Index Crime rate in 1999 was at its lowest point in the 25 years that statewide crime data have been collected.
- During the 10-year period of 1990-1999, the resident population of Hawaii increased 7% while the total number of reported Index Offenses decreased 15%.
- The 1999 decrease in total Index Crime continued the previous 3 years' decreases to reach a level 33% below the highest rate in the 1990's, set in 1995.
- Index Crimes decreased 10% in the State of Hawaii from 1998 to 1999. The number of reported Index Crimes decreased in 6 of the 8 offense categories. Decreasing were robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson. Murder and rape increased.
- Violent offenses were reduced 5.5% in 1999. The 1999 violent crime rate was the lowest since 1985.
- Property crimes declined 10.1% in 1999. In 1995, the property crime rate was at its highest point since 1980's record maximum; by 1999 the rate had fallen to its lowest point since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975.
- Reported Part II Offenses (less serious crimes) increased 4.4% in 1999. Despite the increase, the 1999 Part II Offense rate was the second lowest annual rate since 1986.
- Arrests for total Index Crimes were down 16.2% in 1999; for violent crimes, down 6.2%; and for property crimes, down 17.6%. Arrests for Part II Offenses were virtually unchanged from 1998.
- In 1999, Index Crime arrests of adults decreased 18.4% and juvenile arrests fell 11.0%. Adult arrests for violent crime were reduced 0.1%; juvenile violent crime arrests plummeted 22.2%. The slight decrease in violent crime arrests for adults was due to reductions in rape and robbery arrests, while murder and aggravated assault arrests increased. All 4 violent crime categories contributed to the decrease in juvenile violent crime arrests. For property crime, adult arrests showed a 21.0% decline, while juvenile arrests moved down 9.8%. Part II Offense arrests of adults increased 1.7%, and juvenile Part II arrests declined 6.9% from 1998 to 1999.
- In 1999, the Index Crime rate in the City and County of Honolulu decreased 9.3% to reach its lowest point in the 25 years that statewide crime data have been collected. Rate decreases were reported for 6 of the 8 Index Crime categories. The murder rate increased, while the aggravated assault rate was essentially unchanged.

- In 1999, Hawaii County led the state with a 14.3% decrease in the rate of reported Index Offenses. Hawaii County's Index Crime rate also reached its lowest point in the 25 years that crime data have been collected statewide. Rate decreases were reported for 5 of the 8 Index Crimes: robbery, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.
- The rate of reported Index Offenses in Maui County decreased 6.5% in 1999.

 Decreases in rate were reported for 7 of the 8 Index Offenses; only the burglary rate increased. Maui's Index Crime rate in 1999 was at its lowest point in the last 24 years.
- In Kauai County, the Index Crime rate decreased 8.8% in 1999 to set a record low.
 Rate decreases were recorded for 5 of the 8 Index Crime categories; each of these also
 posted an individual record low rate. No murders were reported for the second
 consecutive year, although rape and robbery rates increased.

In 1999, the City and County of Honolulu reported the state's highest rates for total violent Index Crimes, murder, robbery, and motor vehicle theft, while recording the lowest burglary rate. Hawaii County reported the highest forcible rape rate.

Maui County tallied the highest rates for total Index Crimes, aggravated assault, total property Index Crimes, burglary, larceny-theft, and arson. Maui also posted the lowest forcible rape rate. Kauai County recorded the state's lowest rates for 9 of the 11 included crime categories. Forcible rape and burglary were the only offenses with lower rates reported by other counties.

STATE OF HAWAII

In 1999, the Index Crime rate in Hawaii fell 9.5% to a point 21.1% below the state's average rate for the past 10 years. The violent crime rate decreased 4.9% in 1999, and was 12.3% below the average rate for the past 10 years. The property crime rate decreased 9.7% in 1999 to post the lowest annual rate on record. The overall percentage of Index Crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means decreased to 17.4% in 1998, from 18.9% in 1998.

The number of murders increased from 1998's record low of 24 to 44 in 1999. Of the total victims in 1999, 70.5% were male, 29.5% female. Twenty-one victims were acquainted with their killers, 7 were married or related to the offenders, 5 were strangers, 2 were friends, and in 9 cases the relationship was unknown. The percentage of murders committed with firearms rose from 1998's 25% (6 victims) to 45% (20) in 1999. The number of strongarm murders remained stable (10 victims), with the result that physical force accounted for 42% of 1998's murders but dropped to 23% of the 1999 offenses.

The forcible rape rate increased 1.0% in 1999, but remained 5.1% below the average rate for the past 10 years.

The robbery rate continued its retreat from 1996's 15-year high point, with a drop of 14.6% in 1999. The 1999 rate was 17.3% below the 10-year average.

The aggravated assault rate was unchanged from 1998 to 1999. The 1999 rate was 2.8% below the 10-year average.

The burglary rate set a record low, dropping 15.2% from 1998 to a point 27.6% below the 10-year average.

The larceny-theft rate declined to its lowest point in 24 years, decreasing 7.5% from 1998. The 1999 rate was 20.4% below the 10-year average.

The motor vehicle theft rate fell 16.4% in 1999, reaching its lowest point since 1992. This rate was 18.3% below the 10-year average.

The rate of arson crimes was reduced to the lowest point on record in 1999, down 5.4% from 1999 and 8.6% below the 10-year average.

In 1999, over \$51.4 million worth of property was reported stolen in Index Crimes in the state, down 13.8% from 1998 and 33.6% from 1996's record high. \$9.5 million, or 18.4% of the value of property stolen in 1999, was recovered. Larceny-thefts accounted for 49.7% of the reported value of property stolen, the greatest portion of which involved thefts from motor vehicles (\$8.0 million).

In 1998, the Index Crime rate in Hawaii was 15.8% higher than the overall national rate. Hawaii's crime rate was also 14.3% higher than that in the Pacific States region of Alaska, California, Oregon, Washington, and Hawaii.

CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU

Seventy-three percent of the residents of Hawaii live in the City and County of Honolulu. In 1999, 74.5% of the State's total Index Crimes, 78.9% of the violent crimes, and 74.2% of the property crimes were reported in Honolulu.

Honolulu's total Index Crime rate decreased 9.3% from 1998 to 1999 to reach its lowest point since statewide crime data collection began in 1975. The crime rate is relatively low compared to cities of comparable population—in 1998, the total crime rate in cities with a population of 500,000 to 999,999 was 39.5% higher than in Honolulu. In 1999, Honolulu cleared 15.2% of its Index Crimes.

In 1999, the violent crime rate continued to decrease from 1995's all-time high, with a decrease of 5.4% from 1998. However, the murder rate rose 115% following 1998's record low point. The forcible rape and robbery rates were down 2.2% and 13.2% respectively, while the aggravated assault rate was unchanged from 1998.

Honolulu's property crime rate decreased 9.5% in 1999 to set a record low point. In 1999 the burglary rate was reduced 20.2%, setting its 4th consecutive record low point. The 1999 burglary rate was 62.3% below the 1975 level. The larceny-theft rate, which accounted for 71% of Honolulu's total Index Offense rate in 1999, declined 6.2% from 1998 to reach its lowest point since 1975. The motor vehicle theft rate dropped 15.2% to its lowest point since 1992.

In 1998, \$38.0 million in property was reported stolen, of which \$5.8 million (15.3%) was recovered. The total value of stolen property was down 15.8% from 1998's total and 39.1% from 1996's record high. Larceny-thefts accounted for 51.7% of the total value stolen.

HAWAII COUNTY

With 12.0% of the State's population, Hawaii County accounted for 10.1% of the statewide total reported Index Offenses, 9.2% of the violent crimes, and 10.2% of the property crimes.

The Index Crime rate decreased 14.3% in 1999 to reach a record low point. The 1999 rate was 20.6% below the average for the past 10 years. Among the 4 counties, Hawaii County posted the second lowest crime rate in the state in 1999. A total of 33.5% of Index Crimes were cleared.

The violent crime rate in Hawaii County was unchanged from 1998 to 1999. The 1999 rate was 13.3% below the average violent crime rate in the past 10 years. The robbery rate decreased 44.1% to its lowest point since 1987. The overall property crime rate in Hawaii County decreased 14.9% in 1999. All 4 property crime categories decreased in rate. The burglary rate reached a record low point, while the larceny-theft rate was at its lowest point in the last 24 years.

Over \$4.4 million of property was reported stolen in Hawaii County in 1999, of which 20.1% was recovered. The value of property stolen increased 3.2% from 1998. Almost half (47.9%) of the reported value of property stolen in Index Crimes was lost in larceny-thefts.

MAUI COUNTY

In 1999, 10.3% of the State's residents lived in Maui County. During 1999, 11.8% of the State's total Index Crimes, 9.6% of the violent crimes, and 11.9% of the property crimes were reported in Maui County.

The Index Crime rate fell 6.5% in 1999 to reach its lowest point in the past 24 years. The clearance rate for Index Crimes increased from 15.8% in 1998 to 16.6% in 1999.

Maui's violent crime rate decreased 7.9% in 1999, and was 4.8% below the 10-year average rate. The number of reported violent crimes fell 7.3%, as a result of decreases in 3 of the 4 violent crime categories (aggravated assaults were unchanged from 1998). The forcible rape rate fell 30.6% from 1998 to reach its lowest level since 1990. The robbery rate fell 6.7%.

The property crime rate decreased 6.5% in 1999 to set a record low since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975. Among the 4 property crimes, 3 decreased; only burglaries increased. The rate for burglary was the second lowest recorded, following 1998's record low. The larceny-theft rate was the lowest in the past 24 years, and the motor vehicle theft rate reached its lowest point on record.

The property reported stolen in 1999 was valued at \$7.4 million, down 11.9% from 1998. In 1998, over \$2.4 million, or 32.5% of the stolen value, was recovered. Among the 4 counties, and for the 8th consecutive year, Maui had the highest percentage of stolen property recovered. Larcenythefts accounted for 42.0% of the value of property stolen in Index Crimes.

KAUAI COUNTY

In 1999, 4.8% of the State's population resided in Kauai County. During 1999, 3.6% of State's Index Crimes, 2.2% of the violent crimes, and 3.7% of the property crimes were reported in Kauai County.

In 1999, for the third consecutive year, Kauai County had the lowest total crime rate in the state. The Index Crime rate fell 8.8% from 1998 to set a record low point. The 1999 Index clearance rate was 18.2%.

Kauai's violent crime rate in 1998 was at its third lowest point on record, up 2.8% from 1998 and 8.3% from 1997's record low point. In 1999, there were 6 more reported rapes and 1 more robbery, while aggravated assaults decreased by 5 and murders were unchanged at 0. The aggravated assault rate was the lowest on record.

The property crime rate in Kauai County continued to decrease in 1999, down 9.1% from 1998 to set a record low, and 19.0% below the 10-year average rate. In 1999, all 4 property crime categories decreased to set record low rates.

The value of property reported stolen in 1999 totaled \$1.6 million, of which 22.5% was recovered. The total stolen in 1999 was 14.5% less than in 1998. Larceny-thefts accounted for 41.6% of the value of property stolen in 1999.

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The Uniform Crime Reporting Program

BACKGROUND

The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) to meet a recognized need for a nationwide system to collect crime statistics. Since there are numerous differences in criminal codes throughout the United States, the UCR program uses a standard definition for each offense. Law enforcement agencies submit data in accordance to these definitions rather than local statutes. This standardization allows for interjurisdictional comparisons and internal validity of national totals.

The national UCR program is administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Definitions of specific offenses, as well as reporting criteria, are contained in the FBI's publication *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook*. The FBI provides report forms and training to city, county, and state law enforcement agencies. Crime data are collected by over 16,000 local enforcement agencies and reported to the FBI. The FBI assembles, publishes, and distributes a comprehensive annual publication entitled *Crime in the United States*, as well as periodic special reports.

In an effort to streamline procedures and provide consistency and comparability of data, the FBI promoted the development of state UCR programs. The purpose of the state-level UCR program is to collect data from local law enforcement agencies and assure compliance with standards developed jointly by the FBI and IACP.

Hawaii's UCR program was housed in the Judiciary from its inception in 1975 until 1981, when it was transferred to the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center, a Division of the Department of the Attorney General. In 1991, the program was transferred from the Data Center to the Research and Statistics Branch of the Crime Prevention Division, which in 1995 became the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division.

The Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division collects and reviews the recently computerized UCR reports received from the 4 county police departments before mailing the reports to the FBI. The Division is also responsible for providing technical assistance to the contributing agencies, as well as serving as the FBI's single point of contact in the state for distributing program information.

CRIME STATISTICS

Consistent with the UCR objectives of providing the best representation of total crime and providing the most meaningful data to police departments, the UCR program collects data on reported offenses and arrests. It is widely understood that offenses known to police are an underrepresentation of the total number of crimes committed, and that a truly reliable measure of unreported crimes is difficult to obtain. However, the use of reported offenses as official statistics can be verified and compared over time.

Because of their seriousness and frequency of occurrence, 7 offenses were initially chosen by the IACP to comprise a Crime Index and serve as indicators of our nation's crime experience: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter; forcible rape; robbery; aggravated

assault; burglary; larceny-theft; and motor vehicle theft. In 1979, a congressional mandate added arson as the eighth Crime Index Offense.¹

Information reported for Index Offenses includes: the number of crimes committed; the number of offenses cleared by arrest or by exceptional means²; the number of persons arrested, and the value of property destroyed by arson and taken in each of the remaining offenses, except aggravated assault. (By definition, property cannot be taken in an assault. An offense that begins as an assault but ends with property being taken is classified as robbery.) The 8 Crime Index offenses plus the crime of negligent manslaughter are referred to as Part I offenses. While complete information is collected on nontraffic-related negligent manslaughters, this offense is rare and not mentioned in *Crime in the United States*. Part II offenses include all other offenses, except traffic, not included in Part I. The national UCR program collects and reports only arrest data for Part II offenses, while *Crime in Hawaii* additionally contains reported Part II offense statistics.³ The total Part II Offense data were obtained from the annual reports of the 4 county police departments. Total negligent manslaughter arrests, including traffic-related, are included in *Crime in Hawaii* with the Part II arrests.

Definitions of terms used in this report appear in Appendices A and B. More detailed descriptions of the UCR program can be obtained from the *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook* published by the FBI of the United States Department of Justice. Trends in law enforcement officers killed and assaulted (LEOKA) are reported in Appendix C.

Population estimates used to calculate crime rates for *Crime in Hawaii 1999* are contained in Appendix D. Revised population estimates for 1990-1998 were used to recalculate crime rates for those prior years in *Crime in Hawaii 1999*. As a result, some of the rates differ from those published in *Crime in Hawaii 1998*; however, all changes differ by, at most, 1% from previously reported rates.

UCR program rules for classifying and counting crimes are somewhat complex and can, at times, even appear contradictory. Prior to delving into the pages that follow, first-time readers of *Crime in Hawaii* are encouraged to read the "Caveats" page, which precedes the Forward. All readers are requested to review this page when attempting to answer questions about how crimes and arrests are counted, and to contact us if their questions remain unanswered. Contact information is at the bottom of the "Caveats" page.

STATE DEVELOPMENTS

The current UCR program in Hawaii is summary-based. It does not collect data on individual crime incidents or victim characteristics (except for murder), or differentiate between military, visitor, or resident victims or offenders. A statistical reporting system that would provide these capabilities was promulgated by the FBI in 1988. The National Incident Based Reporting

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¹ Hawaii has collected arson offense data since 1980. Nationally, a number of jurisdictions do not report arson offenses to the FBI. Also, the Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson offenses. This means that all arsons which become known to the police are counted, so that crime incidents which include arson and one or more of the other Index Offenses are counted twice. As a result, the FBI does not include arsons in calculating and reporting total Index Crimes or property crimes and their respective crime rates. In order to remain consistent with federal reporting, Hawaii also does not include arsons in total Index Crimes and property crimes. Arson offenses are also not counted in the grand total of Index & Part II Offenses, the last row on the 10-year offense summary pages for the state and counties.

² An offense cleared by exceptional means is one in which the offender and his or her exact location are known to the law enforcement agency but, for reasons beyond the control of the agency, the offender cannot be arrested. See Appendix A for definition and examples.

See Appendix B for definitions of Part II Offenses.

System (NIBRS) collects individual records relating to each crime incident and its associated arrest (if any), in contrast to the UCR program's monthly summary counts of offenses, clearances, arrests, and totals of the value of property stolen and recovered in the various crime categories. The increased volume and complexity of data in NIBRS make the system costly, and implementation has been slow, especially in major cities with high crime rates.

In 1992, the Hawaii Legislature provided funds to determine if the Hawaii UCR program is adequate, effective, and efficient and to recommend an appropriate course of action as needed to satisfy the crime statistics and information requests of the State of Hawaii and its contributing law enforcement agencies. The proposed alternatives needed to be compatible with the requirements of NIBRS and be capable of capturing data regarding hate crimes.

The contract to conduct the comprehensive study of the UCR program was awarded to SEARCH Group, the National Consortium for Justice Information and Statistics, in July 1993. The final report, which included a recommendation for a three-phase implementation of an incident-based reporting system, was presented to the Legislature in January, 1994. However, authorization to proceed with the suggested plan was not approved.

In 1996 and 1998, the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) of the U.S. Department of Justice awarded grants to SEARCH Group to explore the impediments to NIBRS reporting in various localities and develop a number of pilot implementations to demonstrate how these difficulties can be overcome. In connection with the second grant, and at the request of the Attorney General, SEARCH visited Hawaii's 4 police departments in April, 1999.

In May 2000, BJS announced a grant to state UCR programs to select and fund major city or county police departments for NIBRS development. The Maui Police Department, the Honolulu Police Department, and the Department of the Attorney General applied for funding under this grant.

STATE OF HAWAII

The nature of crime in Hawaii is different from the United States in general. Nationally, violent crimes accounted for 12% of the Crime Index in 1999, while in Hawaii in 1999 only 5% of the Crime Index was comprised of violent crimes.

The number of reported Index Offenses decreased 9.9% from 1998 to 1999 in Hawaii to reach the lowest level since 1985. When population changes are accounted for, however, *Hawaii's* 1999 Index Crime rate is the lowest on record since the start of statewide data collection in 1975. In 1999, reported violent offenses decreased 5.5% and reported property offenses decreased 10.1%. The number of offenses reported in Hawaii for 6 of the 8 Index Crime categories decreased in 1999; murders and forcible rapes increased. Reported Part II Offenses were reduced by 1.9%, and the grand total of Index & Part II Offenses decreased 4.8% from 1998 to 1999

The table on the next page lists the actual numbers of reported crimes and status offenses, excluding traffic offenses, in the State of Hawaii during the past 10 years. Five Index Offense categories show lower offense totals in 1999 than in 1990, while the number of reported offenses was higher in 2 categories and murders were unchanged.






Total Reported Index & Part II Offenses State of Hawaii, 1990-1999










Proportions of Violent Index Crimes State of Hawaii, 1999




Violent Offense Rates, State of Hawaii, 1990-1999

















Proportions of Property Index Crimes State of Hawaii, 1999















CITY & COUNTY OF HONOLULU

The character of crime in the State of Hawaii is clearly reflected in offense statistics for the City and County of Honolulu. In 1999, 72.9% of the State's population resided in the City and County of Honolulu. During 1999, 74.5% of the State's Index Crimes, 78.9% of the violent crimes, and 74.2% of the property crimes were reported in the City and County of Honolulu.

From 1998 to 1999, the number of reported offenses decreased in 7 of the 8 Index Crime categories in Honolulu. The total number of Index Crimes decreased 10.1%, the number of violent crimes by 6.1%, and the number of property crimes by 10.3%. Murder was the only offense to show an increase, up 117.6% from 1998's record low. The largest decrease occurred in burglaries, down 20.9% in 1999. The number of reported motor vehicle thefts decreased 15.9%, and robberies decreased 13.8%. Reported larceny-thefts numbered 7.0% fewer in 1999 than in 1998. Completing the list of changes in Index Crimes were arson, down 5.4%; forcible rape, off 2.9%; and aggravated assault, with a reduction of 1.2%. Reported Part II Offenses showed a decrease of 2.7%, while the Index & Part II grand total decreased 5.8% from 1998 to 1999.

The table on the following page lists the actual number of reported offenses, except traffic, in the City and County of Honolulu during the past 10 years. In 1999, there were fewer forcible rapes, aggravated assaults, burglaries, larceny-thefts, and arsons than in 1990.

Reported Index Offenses City & County of Honolulu, 1990-1999



















HAWAII COUNTY

In 1999, 12.0% of the State's population resided in Hawaii County. During 1999, 10.1% of the State's Index Crimes, 9.2% of the violent crimes, and 10.2% of the property crimes were reported in Hawaii County. From 1998 to 1999, the number of reported Index Crimes decreased 13.9%, the number of violent crimes increased 0.8%, and the number of property crimes decreased 14.5%. The number of reported offenses in 5 Index Crime categories decreased from 1998 to 1999: robbery, 44%; burglary, 16%; larceny-theft, 14%; motor vehicle theft, 22%; and arson, 11%. Increasing in number were murder, up 67% (2 more killings); forcible rape, 38% (17 more offenses); and aggravated assault, 11% (15 more offenses). Reported Part II Offenses increased 6.9%, and the Index & Part II grand total rose 0.5% from 1998 to 1999.

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported offenses, excluding traffic, in Hawaii County during the past 10 years. The population of Hawaii County increased 17% during this period, while the number of Index Crimes reported decreased 22%. Seven of the 8 Index Offenses decreased over the decade; only forcible rapes increased.




















MAUI COUNTY

In 1999, 10.3% of the State's residents lived in Maui County. During 1999, 11.8% of the State's total Index Crimes, 9.6% of the violent crimes, and 11.9% of the property crimes were reported in Maui County.

From 1998 to 1999, the total numbers of reported Index Crimes, violent crimes, and property crimes in Maui County decreased 5.5%, 7.3%, and 5.5%, respectively. The number of offenses in 6 of the 8 Index Crime categories decreased from 1998 to 1999. Reports of aggravated assault were unchanged, while burglaries increased 9%. The decreases were in murder, 50% (2 fewer killings); rape, 30% (14 fewer offenses); robbery, 6% (5 fewer offenses); larceny-theft: 8% (407 fewer offenses), motor vehicle theft, 21% (89 fewer offenses); and arson, 2% (1 less offense). Reported Part II Offenses were reduced by 3.3%, and the Index and Part II grand total decreased 3.8% from 1998 to 1999.

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Maui County from 1990 to 1999. During the past 10 years, the population of Maui County increased 20% while the number of reported Index Crimes increased 2%. Five of the 8 Index Offenses showed decreases over the decade; increasing were forcible rapes, robberies, and larcenythefts.

Reported Index Offenses Maui County, 1990-1999








KAUAI COUNTY

In 1999, 4.8% of the State's population resided in Kauai County. During 1999, 3.6% of the State's Index Crimes, 2.2% of the violent crimes, and 3.7% of the property crimes were reported in Kauai County.

From 1998 to 1999, the total numbers of reported Index Crimes and property crimes decreased 8.3% and 8.6%, respectively, while reported violent crimes increased by 3.3% in Kauai County. Decreases were reported in 5 of the 8 Index Crime categories, and no murders were reported for the second consecutive year. Increasing were reports of forcible rape, up 33% (6 more offenses); and robbery, up 8% (1 more offense). Decreasing were aggravated assault by 17% (5 fewer offenses), burglary by 1% (5 fewer offenses), larceny-theft by 10% (172 fewer offenses), motor vehicle theft by 15% (12 fewer offenses), and arson by 50% (1 less offense). Reported Part II Offenses moved down 10.6%, and the Index and Part II grand total decreased 9.8% from 1998 to 1999.

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Kauai County from 1990 to 1999. During the past 10 years, the population of Kauai County increased 10%. During the same period, the number of reported Index Crimes decreased 20%. Five of the 8 Index Crimes decreased over the decade; increasing were forcible rapes and robberies, while no murders were reported in either 1990 or 1999.

Reported Index Offenses Kauai County, 1990-1999



































ARREST STATISTICS

Arrest data, including the age, sex, and race/ethnicity of the arrestees, are reported by county law enforcement agencies for all violations except most traffic offenses¹. The UCR Program requires that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. As such, arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different offenses.

The most severe violation is recorded for each arrest. The violations are divided into two categories: Index Offenses, including murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; and Part II Offenses, comprised of all other offenses, including manslaughter by negligence². Definitions of Index Crimes and Part II Offenses are included in Appendices A and B, respectively.

Race and ethnicity data are presented using categories specific to Hawaii: White, Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Hawaiian/Part-Hawaiian, Korean, Samoan, and Other Asian or Pacific Islanders. Categories typically employed elsewhere in the nation are more restrictive: White, Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, and Asian or Pacific Islander.

There were a number of new tables introduced in *Crime in Hawaii, 1996.* Primary among these are historical counts of adult and juvenile arrests for the Part II Offense categories. The juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway are traditionally included in Part II. In addition, the status offenses of truancy and ungovernability are included in the Part II arrest category of "All Other Offenses" for juveniles. Arrests for these offenses account for a substantial portion of the Part II and total Index & Part II juvenile arrests. Because these arrest offenses do not exist for adults, any adult-to-juvenile comparison based on traditional Part II totals will be biased in favor of adults. The table on page 116 has dealt with this shortcoming for the separate categories of curfew/loitering and runaway by reporting arrests in these categories separately from other Part II Offense arrests. Curfew and loitering arrests are excluded from the bar chart of the adult and juvenile percentages of the Part II Offense arrests on the same page. Due to space limitations, similar handling was not possible in the 15-year historical tables.

The role that status offenses play in any examination of juvenile arrest trends should also be considered. For example, in 1985, there were 2,771 arrests statewide for the specified status offenses, accounting for 31% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses, and 20% of all juvenile arrests. In 1999, 4,659 statewide status offense arrests were tallied, accounting for 45% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses, and 35% of all juvenile arrests.

¹ Contrary to the rule in which offenses of negligent manslaughter are tallied for non-traffic cases only, arrest totals for this offense include both traffic and non-traffic cases.

The division of crime categories is sometimes still made between Part I, an older term that encompassed Index Offenses plus manslaughter by negligence, and Part II, which includes all other offenses. The sections herein on reported offenses (pages 8-101) and arrests (pages 103-163) include manslaughter by negligence with the Part II Offenses for two reasons: 1) the current emphasis of the UCR Program, and this report, is on Index Offenses (which exclude manslaughter by negligence) rather than Part I Offenses; and 2) the FBI's national report, *Crime in the United States*, groups arrest data by Index Offenses and all other offenses; arrests for manslaughter by negligence are excluded entirely.











APPENDIX A

DEFINITIONS

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury; attempted murder. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed. Attacks by personal weapons, such as hands, fists, feet, etc., which result in serious or aggravated injury.

ARSON: Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

ASSAULT: An unlawful attack by one person upon another. Includes Aggravated Assault (Part I Offense) and Other Assaults (Part II Offense).

BURGLARY: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry where no entry occurs.

CLEARANCE: An offense is "cleared" either by arrest or exceptional means. An offense is cleared by arrest when at least one person is arrested; charged with the commission of the offense; and turned over to the court for prosecution. An offense is cleared by exceptional means when the identity of the offender is known; there is enough evidence to support an arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution; the exact location of the offender is known; and, for reasons outside the control of law enforcement, the offender cannot be arrested, charged, and prosecuted. Examples of offenses cleared by exceptional means include suicide of the offender, double murder, deathbed confession, and denied extradition. It should be noted that the number of offenses and not the number of persons arrested is used to count clearances. Several offenses may be cleared by the arrest of one person; or the arrest of several people may clear only one offense.

CRIME INDEX: The eight Part I Offenses reported in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program to represent the status of crime in the United States: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larcenytheft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

CRIME RATE: The number of crimes per 100,000 population (usually the resident population): Crime Rate = Number of Crimes x 100,000

Resident Population

More accurate crime rates (e.g., the number of rapes per 100,000 females or the number of motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 vehicles) are not reported in *Crime in the U.S.* and, therefore, are not used in *Crime in Hawaii*.

CRIMINAL HOMICIDE: The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another or the killing of another person through gross negligence. Includes Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), and Manslaughter by Negligence.

DE FACTO POPULATION: The number of persons physically present in an area, regardless of military status or usual place of residence. Includes visitors present and excludes residents temporarily absent.

FORCIBLE RAPE: The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included. Statutory rape (without force), any sexual assaults against males, and other sex offenses are not included in this category.

JUVENILE: Person under the age of 18.

LARCENY-THEFT: The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Includes pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, theft from motor vehicles, theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, etc. Does not include embezzlement, forgery, or motor vehicle theft.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT: The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

MURDER: The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another.

NONVIOLENT OFFENSES: Include the offense categories of larceny-theft, burglary, and auto theft. Often referred to as Property Offenses (excluding robbery).

PART I OFFENSES: Offenses which make up the Crime Index: murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; plus the offense of manslaughter by negligence.

PART II OFFENSES: All criminal offenses not classified as Part I Offenses. Also included are the juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway. See Appendix B for specific Part II Offense definitions.

PROPERTY OFFENSES: Include larceny-theft, burglary, auto theft, and arson. Robbery is classified as a violent crime due to the use or threat of force.

RESIDENT POPULATION: The number of persons whose usual place of residence is in an area, regardless of physical location on the estimated census date. Includes military personnel stationed or homeported in the area and excludes persons of local origin attending school or in military service outside the area.

ROBBERY: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim(s) in fear. While robbery has the attributes of a property crime, it is grouped with violent crimes due to the additional attribute of force or the threat of force.

VIOLENT OFFENSES: Include the offense categories of murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

APPENDIX B

PART II OFFENSES

CRIMINAL OFFENSES

ASSAULT, OTHER: Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim. Examples include simple assault, assault and battery, resisting or obstructing an officer, intimidation, coercion, and hazing.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT: Committing a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; and blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE: Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of intoxicants.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS: Include all violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of illegal drugs.

EMBEZZLEMENT: Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING: All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possession of, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of what is true.

FRAUD: Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks (except forgeries and counterfeiting), confidence games, and unauthorized withdrawal of money from an automatic teller machine.

GAMBLING: Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling. Includes 3 subcategories: bookmaking, numbers and lottery, and "other" gambling.

LIQUOR LAWS: Include unlawful manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor; and drinking on a train or public conveyance. Do not include Drunkenness and Driving Under the Influence.

MANSLAUGHTER BY NEGLIGENCE: The killing of another person through gross negligence. Manslaughter by negligence is considered a Part I Offense, but is not included in the Crime Index.

OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN: Include all charges of nonsupport, and neglect or abuse of family and children. Examples include desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and nonpayment of alimony.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE: Sex offenses of a commercialized nature. Include prostitution; keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame; pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.; and all attempts.

SEX OFFENSES: Include indecent exposure, incest, statutory rape (no force), any sexual assaults against males, other offenses against common decency and morals, and all attempts. Do not include forcible rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice.

STOLEN PROPERTY: Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, including attempts.

VAGRANCY: Persons arrested on grounds of "suspicion" may be prosecuted on this charge. Includes vagrancy, begging, loitering (persons 18 and over), and vagabondage.

VANDALISM: The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

WEAPONS OFFENSES: Include unlawful manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; unlawful carrying of deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc. silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to a minor; and all attempts to commit any of the above.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES: Include all other state and local offenses (excluding traffic violations) not included elsewhere. Examples are:

- Admitting minors to improper places
- Abduction and compelling to marry
- Bigamy and polygamy
- Blackmail and extortion
- Combination in restraint of trade; trusts, monopolies
- Contempt of court
- Criminal anarchism
- Discrimination, unfair competition
- Kidnapping
- Marriage within prohibited degrees
- Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency, such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices
- Perjury and subornation of perjury
- Possession, repair, manufacture, etc. of burglar's tools
- Possession of drug paraphernalia
- Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.
- Public nuisances
- Riot and rout
- Trespass
- Unlawfully bringing drugs and liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to Convicts
- Violations of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances
- Violation of quarantine
- Truancy (non-criminal juvenile status offense)
- Ungovernability (non-criminal juvenile status offense)
- All offenses not otherwise classified
- All attempts to commit any of the above

NONCRIMINAL OFFENSES

STATUS OFFENSES (PERSONS UNDER 18): Non-criminal acts or conduct which are offenses only when committed or engaged in by juveniles; include curfew violation and runaways.

CURFEW AND LOITERING: Included are violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.


RUNAWAYS: Apprehension for protective custody as defined by local statute.

NONCRIMINAL ARREST CATEGORY

SUSPICION: While "suspicion" is not an offense, it may be the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by the police.

APPENDIX C

POLICE OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED, AND POLICE DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEE STATISTICS



In 1999, the number of police officers assaulted in the line of duty in the State of Hawaii was the lowest on record since the start of statewide crime data collection in 1975. The graph above shows the trend of assaults on officers during the past 15 years. From 1985 to 1999, the number of such assaults decreased 45.5%, from 466 in 1985 to 254 in 1999. The 15-year trend was at its highest point in 1988, when 567 assaults were recorded, while in 1999 it declined for the fourth consecutive year. In 1999, the number of police officers assaulted decreased 22.1%, from 326 in 1998 to 1999's 254.

By county, assaults on officers in 1999 were distributed 81.1% (206) to Honolulu, 8.7% (22) to Hawaii County, 8.7% (22) to Maui County, and 1.6% (4) to Kauai County.

As in all of the other years since 1978, most of the assaults on police officers during 1999 occurred when responding to disturbance calls (153, 60.2%). Police officers attempting an arrest comprised the next most likely group to be targeted for assaults in 1999 (29, 11.4%). Traffic pursuits accounted for 27 of the assaults (10.6%). Fifteen (5.9%) of the assaulted officers were handling/transporting prisoners, and 11 (4.3%) were investigating suspicious persons.

Physical force was the most typical means of assault. Eighty-nine percent (227) of the officers assaulted in 1999 were assaulted by hands, fists, or other bodily means. This trend is similar to that of the Pacific States¹ where most of the assaults on police officers were by "personal weapon" (83% in 1998). The bar graphs below show the breakdown of weapons used in assaults and the type of assignment local police officers were on when they were assaulted.



WEAPON USED




On October 31, 1999, 2,727 full-time police officers were employed by the county police departments. Therefore the 254 assaults on officers in 1999 produced an assault rate of 9.3 attacks per 100 officers statewide for 1999. In 1998, the latest year for which national data are available, the assault rate for the State was higher than the rate for the Pacific States: 12.6 versus 10.7 attacks per 100 officers, respectively.


During 1999, 33% (84) of all assaults on police officers occurred between 10:00 p.m. and 2:00 a.m. and 51% (130) occurred between 8:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. Data on the number of police officers assaulted per 100 full-time officers and the time of assaults are shown below.

APPENDIX D

POPULATION ESTIMATES

State and county resident population estimates for *Crime in Hawaii 1999* were provided by the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT). Revised DBEDT population figures for 1990-1998 were used to recalculate the crime rates for these prior years. As a result, the rates for these years differ from those published in *Crime in Hawaii 1998*; however, all changes differ by, at most, 1% from previously published rates.

The United States census of population is taken as of April 1 in each year ending in zero. Intercensal population estimates are made as of July 1 in each non-census year. Estimates based on the just completed census are also made for July 1 of census years. While the FBI continues to use exact census populations to calculate crime rates in census years, *Crime in Hawaii 1999* used July 1 estimated populations to determine crime rates for all years. In so doing, a regular progression of estimates taken at 12-month intervals is available to more accurately reflect crime rate trends.
