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# A REVIEW OF UNIFORM CRIME REPORTS

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#### Caveats

Statistical crime reporting requires a number of rules to count events consistently. Multiple offenses may be committed in most opportunities for crime, and multiple charges may be attached to a single arrest. The statistics presented in this report were collected and compiled using the FBI's Hierarchy Rule that limits crime counts to only the most serious offense committed within an incident that is constrained by time and place, and limits arrest counts to only the most serious charge per booking. Therefore, some crimes may be underreported, e.g., if the victim is killed in a single-victim robbery situation, only murder is recorded, not the crime of robbery. Further details of the Hierarchy Rule are discussed in Footnote 1 on page 2.

The number of reported offenses corresponds to a victim count for only some types of offenses. Violent crimes generally employ the total victim count. Robberies, however, are counted by the incident, regardless of the number of victims. Property crimes also are generally counted by the incident, with the notable exceptions that a burglary is counted for each structure entered, and a motor vehicle theft for each vehicle stolen.

Some crimes are inherently difficult to classify. The UCR definition of aggravated assault, for example, is complex and has been misinterpreted, resulting in large variations between agencies and between years.

These statistics were produced from the operations of Hawaii's 4 county police departments. Statistics of prosecutorial, court, and parole board decisions are reported separately, by those agencies.

It is strongly cautioned that year-to-year changes based on small numbers of events are likely to result in large percentage changes which typically are not as meaningful as they might appear at first glance.

An unappreciated difference in the time period covered by two different sets of statistics can lead to erroneous conclusions regarding underlying relationships. For example, an abrupt change in the "percent of offenses cleared" statistics, which link the volume of arrests to the volume of reported offenses, should be viewed with caution because offenses already reported in previous years may be counted as cleared, by arrest or exceptional means, in the current year. A clearance is further defined in Appendix A.

The distinction between resident and de facto population is a most important consideration in viewing *Crime in Hawaii*. Crime rates are based on the number of crimes per 100,000 residents. De facto population includes the number of persons physically present in the state: residents, tourists, and non-resident military personnel. Crime rates based on de facto population can be significantly different than rates based on resident population. The UCR program uses resident population to calculate crime rates for all states. However, because of Hawaii's relatively small resident population and large visitor population, crime rates based on resident population are much higher when compared to rates based on the actual number of people in the state.

These and other issues surrounding the collection and compilation of crime and arrest data can contribute to the misinterpretation of statistics presented in this report. 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#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The character of crime in Hawaii is largely dissimilar to other areas of the United States. Nationally, 88% of the Index Crimes in 1999 were property crimes and 12% were violent crimes. In Hawaii, 95% of the Index Crimes in 2000 were property crimes and only 5% were violent crimes.

A 25-year record low in the rate of reported Index Crimes was reached in 1999. Although the number of reported Index Crimes in Hawaii increased 9.9% from 1999 to 2000, this tally nevertheless marks the second lowest point in the 26-year history of Hawaii's Uniform Crime Reporting Program.

In 1999, Hawaii was ranked 42<sup>nd</sup> among the 50 states on the basis of resident population, 13<sup>th</sup> for total Index Crime rate per 100,000 residents, 43<sup>rd</sup> for violent Index Crime rate, and 10<sup>th</sup> for property Index Crime rate. Hawaii has traditionally reported comparatively low violent crime rates and high property crime rates.

In 1999, the latest year for which national data are available, Hawaii ranked 29<sup>th</sup> in the nation per 100,000 resident population for reported murders, 26th for forcible rapes, 29<sup>th</sup> for robberies, and 45<sup>th</sup> for aggravated assaults. In property crimes, Hawaii ranked 19<sup>th</sup> for burglaries, 6<sup>th</sup> for larceny-thefts, and 22<sup>nd</sup> for motor vehicle thefts.

Other highlights of this report include:

- Hawaii's Index Crime rate in 2000 was at its second lowest point in the 26 years since statewide crime data have been collected.
- Reported violent Index Offenses increased 6.1% from 1999 to 2000, but the two most serious violent offenses, murder and forcible rape, decreased, 20.5% and 2.3%, respectively.
- Reported property Index Offenses increased 10.1% from 1999 to 2000 and Part II Offenses increased 5.5%.
- Four Index Offense categories murder, forcible rape, burglary, and larceny-theft show overall decreases in 2000 when compared to 1991. Robbery, aggravated assault, motor vehicle theft, and arson increased during the same period.
- Total arrests for Index Crimes decreased 2.7% in 2000. Arrests for violent Index Crimes increased 11.7% and decreased 5.0% for property crimes.
- Adult arrests comprised 69% of Total Index arrests; juvenile arrests accounted for 31%.
- In 2000, the number of reported Index Offenses in the City & County of Honolulu increased 9.3%. This tally is the second lowest on record. Of the reported Index Crimes, only murder showed a decrease from 1999 to 2000.
- In 2000, the number of reported Index Offenses in Hawaii County increased 10.5%, also marking the second lowest point on record. The number of reported offenses for 3 of the reported Index Crimes decreased from 1999 to 2000: murder, forcible rape, and aggravated assault.
- The total number of reported Index Offenses in Maui County increased 8.4% from 1999 to 2000. Decreases were reported in 3 of the total Index Offenses: forcible rape, robbery, and arson.
- In 2000, the total number of reported Index Offenses in Kauai County increased 24.2%.
   Only one of the Index Offenses, forcible rape, showed a decrease.

#### State of Hawaii

The Index Crime rate in Hawaii increased 7.5% in 2000 to reach a point 13.9% below the state's average rate for the past 10 years. The violent crime rate increased 3.8% in 2000 and the property crime rate increased 7.7%. Reported Violent Index Offenses comprised a smaller percentage of all Index Offenses in 2000 (4.7%) than in 1999 (4.9%). The overall percentage of Index Crimes cleared by arrest or exceptional means decreased from 17.4% in 1999 to 14.7% in 2000.

The number of murders decreased 21.6%, with 35 murders in 2000, down from 44 in 1999. Of the total victims in 2000, 62.9% were male and 37.1% were female. Twelve of the victims were married or related to their killers, ten of the victims were otherwise acquainted with their killers, 7 were strangers, and in 6 cases the relationship was unknown. The percentage of murders committed with a firearm decreased to 22.9% (8) in 2000, down from 50.1% (22) in 1999. The percentage of murders committed by a knife or other cutting instrument increased to 25.7% (9), up from 15.9% (7) in 1999 while the percentage committed by physical force or a blunt object remained similar to 1999 figures.

The forcible rape rate decreased 4.3% in 2000, and was 2.5% below the average rate for the past 10 years.

The robbery rate increased 5.7% in 2000, still 12.8% below the 10-year average.

The aggravated assault rate increased 6.2% from 1999 to 2000. The 2000 rate was approximately equal to the 10-year average.

The burglary rate increased 10.7% in 2000. This rate was the second lowest on record.

The larceny-theft rate increased 4.6% in 2000, and was 15.5% below the 10-year average.

In 2000, the motor vehicle theft rate showed a significant increase of 28.5%, reaching a point 2.5% above the 10-year average rate.

The arson rate increased 8.1% in 2000, marking a slight increase (1.3%) over the 10-year average.

In 2000, over \$59.3 million worth of property was reported stolen in Index Crimes in the State, up 15.3% from 1999. Of the total value of property stolen in 2000, about \$9.6 million (16.2%) was recovered. Larceny-thefts accounted for 49.4% of the reported value of property stolen, the greatest portion of which involved thefts from motor vehicles (\$10.5 million).

#### City & County of Honolulu

Seventy-two percent of the residents of Hawaii live in the City & County of Honolulu. In 2000, 74.1% of the State's total Index Crimes, 77.9% of the violent crimes, and 73.9% of the property crimes were reported in Honolulu.

Honolulu's total Index Crime rate increased 7.9% from 1999 to 2000, marking its second lowest point in the 26 years since statewide crime data collection begin in 1975. In 2000, Honolulu cleared 12.7% of its Index Crimes.

Honolulu's violent crime rate increased 3.5% in 2000. However, violent crimes represented a lower percentage of all Index Offenses in 2000 (4.9%) than in 1999 (5.2%). The most serious crime, murder, decreased 46.5% in rate. The forcible rape rate increased slightly (0.7%) in 2000. Robbery and aggravated assault both rose in 2000, 6.7% and 2.5%, respectively.

Honolulu's property crime rate increased 8.1% in 2000. The burglary rate increased 12.6% but remained lower than in all but one of the past 26 years. The 2000 larceny-theft rate increased 4.5% and the motor vehicle theft rate showed a marked increase of 28.8%. The rate of reported arsons increased 15.8%.

In 2000, \$44.1 million worth of property was stolen, of which 12.0% was recovered. Larceny-thefts accounted for over half (51.6%) of the total value stolen.

## Hawaii County

With 12.3% of the State's population, Hawaii County accounted for 10.2% of the statewide total reported Index Offenses, 8% of the violent crimes, and 10.3% of the property crimes.

Hawaii County's Index Crime rate increased 5.8% in 2000 but remained well below the 10-year average and marked the second lowest rate in 26 years. Hawaii County posted the lowest total Index, violent, and property crime rates of all 4 counties in 2000. A total of 26.6% of all reported Index Offenses were cleared.

The violent crime rate decreased 11.7% in 2000. Of the violent crimes, the murder rate showed the largest decrease, dropping 22.9%. The forcible rape rate decreased 18.2% and the aggravated assault rate decreased 19.0%. The robbery rate increased 26.0% but remained 12.5% below the 10-year average. The overall property crime rate increased 6.6% in 2000. Three of the 4 property Index Crimes increased: larceny-theft (7.8%); motor vehicle theft (27.7%); and arson (2.7%). The rate of reported burglaries dropped 0.8% in 2000.

Over \$4.9 million worth of property was reported stolen in Hawaii County in 2000, of which 13% was recovered. The value of property stolen increased 10.6% from 1999. Larceny-thefts comprised the majority (61.3%) of the total value stolen.

## **Maui County**

In 2000, 10.6% of the State's residents lived in Maui County. During 2000, 11.6% of the State's total Index Crimes, 9.2% of the violent crimes, and 11.8% of the property crimes were reported in Maui County.

Maui County's Index Crime rate increased 3.2% in 2000. The clearance rate for Index Crimes decreased from 16.6% in 1999 to 12.1% in 2000.

The violent crime rate fell 4.1% in 2000. Two of the reported violent Index Crimes increased; murder by 143.8% (5 murders in 2000 versus 2 in 1999) and aggravated assaults by 4.9%. Forcible rape and robbery showed decreases in the rate of reported offenses, 13.3% and 18.5%, respectively.

Maui County's property crime rate increased 3.5% in 2000 but was 15.0% under its 10-year average. Two of the 4 property Index Crimes increased in 2000; burglary (8.4%) and motor vehicle theft (35.3%). The rate of reported larceny-thefts remained virtually unchanged (-0.2%) and the arson rate dropped 29.7%.

In 2000, the value of property stolen in Maui County tallied \$8.3 million, of which 39.7% was recovered. Motor vehicle theft accounted for the largest proportion (41%) of the value of property stolen.

## Kauai County

In 2000, 4.8% of the State's population resided in Kauai County. During 2000, 4.1% of the State's Index Crimes, 4.9% of the violent crimes, and 4.1% of the property crimes were reported in Kauai County.

The rate of reported Index Crimes increased 20.1% in 2000. The 2000 clearance rate was 18.9%.

Kauai County's violent crime rate showed a sharp increase (123.6%) in 2000. This spike was largely the result of an increase in the rate of reported aggravated assaults, up 293.2%. However, the high rate of aggravated assaults in 2000 reflects, in part, Kauai's reclassification of aggravated assaults in accordance with UCR guidelines. Kauai's 2000 murder rate increased from 0.0 in 1999 to 10.3 in 2000, and the robbery rate increased 3.9%. Of the 4 violent Index Offenses, only forcible rape showed a decrease, dropping 7.3%.

Kauai County's property crime rate increased 16.9% in 2000. All four of the property Index Crimes showed increases in 2000.

The total value of property stolen in Kauai County during 2000 was \$1.9 million, of which 19.9% was recovered. Larceny-thefts accounted for 51.2% of the total value of property stolen in 2000.

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## **The Uniform Crime Reporting Program**

#### BACKGROUND

The Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program was initiated in 1930 by the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) to meet a recognized need for a nationwide system to collect crime statistics. Since there are numerous differences in criminal codes throughout the United States, the UCR program uses a standard definition for each offense. Law enforcement agencies submit data in accordance to these definitions rather than local statutes. This standardization allows for interjurisdictional comparisons and internal validity of national totals.

The national UCR program is administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Definitions of specific offenses, as well as reporting criteria, are contained in the FBI's publication *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook*. The FBI provides report forms and training to city, county, and state law enforcement agencies. Crime data are collected by over 16,000 local enforcement agencies and reported to the FBI. The FBI assembles, publishes, and distributes a comprehensive annual publication entitled *Crime in the United States*, as well as periodic special reports.

In an effort to streamline procedures and provide consistency and comparability of data, the FBI promoted the development of state UCR programs. The purpose of the state-level UCR program is to collect data from local law enforcement agencies and assure compliance with standards developed jointly by the FBI and IACP.

Hawaii's UCR program was housed in the Judiciary from its inception in 1975 until 1981, when it was transferred to the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center, a Division of the Department of the Attorney General. In 1991, the program was transferred from the Data Center to the Research and Statistics Branch of the Crime Prevention Division, which in 1995 became the Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division.

The Crime Prevention and Justice Assistance Division collects and reviews the recently computerized UCR reports received from the 4 county police departments before mailing the reports to the FBI. The Division is also responsible for providing technical assistance to the contributing agencies, as well as serving as the FBI's single point of contact in the state for distributing program information.

#### CRIME STATISTICS

Consistent with the UCR objectives of providing the best representation of total crime and providing the most meaningful data to police departments, the UCR program collects data on reported offenses and arrests. It is widely understood that offenses known to police are an underrepresentation of the total number of crimes committed, and that a truly reliable measure of unreported crimes is difficult to obtain. However, the use of reported offenses as official statistics can be verified and compared over time.

Because of their seriousness and frequency of occurrence, 7 offenses were initially chosen by the IACP to comprise a Crime Index and serve as indicators of our nation's crime experience: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter; forcible rape; robbery; aggravated

assault; burglary; larceny-theft; and motor vehicle theft. In 1979, a congressional mandate added arson as the eighth Crime Index Offense.<sup>1</sup>

Information reported for Index Offenses includes: the number of crimes committed; the number of offenses cleared by arrest or by exceptional means<sup>2</sup>; the number of persons arrested, and the value of property destroyed by arson and taken in each of the remaining offenses, except aggravated assault. (By definition, property cannot be taken in an assault. An offense that begins as an assault but ends with property being taken is classified as robbery.) The 8 Crime Index offenses plus the crime of negligent manslaughter are referred to as Part I offenses. While complete information is collected on nontraffic-related negligent manslaughters, this offense is rare and not mentioned in *Crime in the United States*. Part II offenses include all other offenses, except traffic, not included in Part I. The national UCR program collects and reports only arrest data for Part II offenses, while *Crime in Hawaii* additionally contains reported Part II offense statistics.<sup>3</sup> The total Part II Offense data were obtained from the annual reports of the 4 county police departments. Total negligent manslaughter arrests, including traffic-related, are included in *Crime in Hawaii* with the Part II arrests.

Definitions of terms used in this report appear in Appendices A and B. More detailed descriptions of the UCR program can be obtained from the *Uniform Crime Reporting Handbook* published by the FBI of the United States Department of Justice. Trends in law enforcement officers killed and assaulted (LEOKA) are reported in Appendix C.

Population estimates used to calculate crime rates for *Crime in Hawaii 2000* are contained in Appendix D.

UCR program rules for classifying and counting crimes are somewhat complex and can, at times, even appear contradictory. Prior to delving into the pages that follow, first-time readers of *Crime in Hawaii* are encouraged to read the "Caveats" page, which precedes the Forward. All readers are requested to review this page when attempting to answer questions about how crimes and arrests are counted, and to contact us if their questions remain unanswered. Contact information is at the bottom of the "Caveats" page.

#### STATE DEVELOPMENTS

The current UCR program in Hawaii is summary-based. It does not collect data on individual crime incidents or victim characteristics (except for murder), or differentiate between military, visitor, or resident victims or offenders. A statistical reporting system that would provide these capabilities was promulgated by the FBI in 1988. The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) collects individual records relating to each crime incident and its associated arrest (if any), in contrast to the UCR program's monthly summary counts of offenses, clearances, arrests, and totals of the value of property stolen and recovered in the various crime

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Hawaii has collected arson offense data since 1980. Nationally, a number of jurisdictions do not report arson offenses to the FBI. Also, the Hierarchy Rule does not apply to arson offenses. This means that all arsons which become known to the police are counted, so that crime incidents which include arson and one or more of the other Index Offenses are counted twice. As a result, the FBI does not include arsons in calculating and reporting total Index Crimes or property crimes and their respective crime rates. In order to remain consistent with federal reporting, Hawaii also does not include arsons in total Index Crimes and property crimes. Arson offenses are also not counted in the grand total of Index & Part II Offenses, the last row on the 10-year offense summary pages for the state and counties.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> An offense cleared by exceptional means is one in which the offender and his or her exact location are known to the law enforcement agency but, for reasons beyond the control of the agency, the offender cannot be arrested. See Appendix A for definition and examples.

categories. The increased volume and complexity of data in NIBRS make the system costly, and implementation has been slow, especially in major cities with high crime rates.

In 1992, the Hawaii Legislature provided funds to determine if the Hawaii UCR program is adequate, effective, and efficient and to recommend an appropriate course of action as needed to satisfy the crime statistics and information requests of the State of Hawaii and its contributing law enforcement agencies. The proposed alternatives needed to be compatible with the requirements of NIBRS and be capable of capturing data regarding hate crimes.

The contract to conduct the comprehensive study of the UCR program was awarded to SEARCH Group, the National Consortium for Justice Information and Statistics, in July 1993. The final report, which included a recommendation for a three-phase implementation of an incident-based reporting system, was presented to the Legislature in January, 1994. However, authorization to proceed with the suggested plan was not approved.

In 1996 and 1998, the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) of the U.S. Department of Justice awarded grants to SEARCH Group to explore the impediments to NIBRS reporting in various localities and develop a number of pilot implementations to demonstrate how these difficulties can be overcome. In connection with the second grant, and at the request of the Attorney General, SEARCH visited Hawaii's 4 police departments in April, 1999.

In May 2000, BJS announced a grant to state UCR programs to select and fund major city or county police departments for NIBRS development. The Maui Police Department, the Honolulu Police Department, and the Department of the Attorney General applied for and received funding under this grant. The first steps towards NIBRS implementation in Hawaii will be taken in early 2002.

## STATE OF HAWAII

The nature of crime in Hawaii is different from the United States in general. Nationally, violent crimes accounted for 12% of the Crime Index in 1999, while in Hawaii in 1999 only 5% of the Crime Index was comprised of violent crimes. In the year 2000, violent crimes accounted for only 4.7% of all Index Offenses in the state.

The number of reported Index Offenses increased 9.9% from 1999 to 2000. The 2000 rate of reported Index Offenses, adjusted for population, is the second lowest since 1975. Reported violent offenses increased 6.1%, but the two most serious violent offenses, murder and rape, decreased from 1999 to 2000 (20.5% and 2.3%, respectively). Additionally, violent Index Offenses comprised a smaller portion of all Index Offenses in 2000 (4.7%) than in 1999 (4.9%). Reported property crimes increased 10.1% from 1999 to 2000, while Part II Offenses increased 5.5%. The grand total of Index and Part II Offenses increased 7.0%.

The table on the next page lists the actual numbers of reported crimes and status offenses, excluding traffic offenses, in the State of Hawaii during the past 10 years. Four Index Offense categories – murder, rape, burglary, and larceny-theft – showed lower offense totals in 2000 than in 1991, while the number of reported offenses was higher in the other four categories.
















## Proportions of Violent Index Crimes State of Hawaii, 2000




#### Violent Offense Rates, State of Hawaii, 1991-2000



## Weapons Used in Murder State of Hawaii, 2000







Sex of Offenders State of Hawaii, 2000







Rate per 100,000 Population













## Proportions of Property Index Crimes State of Hawaii, 2000













## **CITY & COUNTY OF HONOLULU**

In the year 2000, 72% of the State's population resided in the City & County of Honolulu. As a by-product, a majority of the crimes in the state are reported in Honolulu. During 2000, 74.1% of the State's Index Crimes, 77.9% of the State's violent crimes, and 73.9% of the State's property crimes were reported in the City & County of Honolulu.

The number of reported offenses increased in seven of the eight Index Crime categories in Honolulu. The total number of Index Crimes increased by 9.3%, the number of violent crimes increased by 4.7%, and the number of property crimes increased by 9.6%. Only murder showed a decrease, from 37 in 1999 to 20 in 2000. The largest increase occurred in motor vehicle thefts, up 30.4% in 2000. Burglaries increased 14.1%, arsons were up 17.1%, and larceny-thefts increased 5.9%. Robberies increased 8.5%, aggravated assaults increased 3.8%, and forcible rapes were up 2.1%. Overall, violent crimes represented a lower percentage of all Index Offenses in 2000 (4.9%) than in 1999 (5.2%).

The table on the following page lists the actual number of reported offenses, except traffic, in the City & County of Honolulu during the past 10 years. In 2000, there were fewer forcible rapes, burglaries, and larceny-thefts than in 1991.

# Reported Index Offenses City & County of Honolulu, 1991-2000













## **HAWAII COUNTY**

In 2000, 12.3% of the State's population resided in Hawaii County. During 2000, 10.2% of the State's Index Crimes, 8% of the violent crimes, and 10.3% of the property crimes were reported in Hawaii County. Overall, the number of reported Index Offenses increased 10.5% from 1999. Three Index Crime categories decreased from 1999 to 2000: murder, 20%; forcible rape, 14.5%, and aggravated assault, 15.4%. Increasing in number were robbery, up 31.7%; burglary, 3.5%; larceny-theft, 12.5%; motor vehicle theft, 33.3%; and arson, 7.1%. Reported Part II Offenses increased 8.3%, and the Index and Part II grand total increased 8.9% from 1999 to 2000. Overall, violent crimes represented a lower percentage of all Index Offenses in 2000 (3.7%) than in 1999 (4.4%)

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported offenses, excluding traffic, in Hawaii County during the past 10 years. The population of Hawaii County increased 17.4% during this period, while the number of reported Index Crimes decreased 11.1%. Five of the 8 Index Offenses decreased over the decade, including murder and aggravated assault.

# Reported Index Offenses Hawaii County, 1991-2000








## **MAUI COUNTY**

In 2000, 10.6% of the State's residents lived in Maui County. During 2000, 11.6% of the State's total Index Crimes, 9.2% of the violent crimes, and 11.8% of the property crimes were reported in Maui County.

From 1999 to 2000, the total number of reported Index Crimes, violent crimes, and property crimes in Maui County increased 8.4%, 8.7%, and 1.1%, respectively. The number of offenses in 5 of the 8 Index Crime categories increased from 1999 to 2000. Decreases were reported for forcible rape, 9.1% (3 fewer offenses); robbery, 14.5% (12 fewer offenses); and arson, 26.1% (12 fewer offenses). Reported Part II Offenses decreased by 5.3%, and the Index and Part II grand total decreased 2.3% from 1999 to 2000. Overall, violent crimes represented a lower percentage of all Index Offenses in 2000 (3.7%) than in 1999 (4.0%).

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Maui County from 1991 to 2000. During the past 10 years, the population of Maui County increased 22% while the number of reported Index Crimes increased 2.7%. Three of the 8 Index Offenses showed decreases over the decade; increasing were robbery, assault, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

## Reported Index Offenses Maui County, 1991-2000





In 2000, 4.8% of the State's population resided in Kauai County. During 2000, 4.1% of the State's Index Crimes, 4.9% of the violent crimes, and 4.1% of the property crimes were reported in Kauai County.

From 1999 to 2000 in Kauai County, the total number of reported Index Crimes and property crimes increased 24.2% and 20.9%, respectively, while reported violent crimes increased by 132.3%. Increases were reported in 7 of the 8 Index Crime categories, while forcible rape fell 4.2% (1 less offense). Increasing were murder, from 0 to 6 offenses; robbery, up 7.7% (1 more offense); aggravated assault, 304% (76 more offenses); burglary, 28.5% (131 more offenses); larceny-theft, 18.7% (278 more offenses); motor vehicle theft, 16.2% (11 more offenses); and arson, 100% (1 more offense). Reported Part II Offenses fell 0.5%, and the Index and Part II grand total increased 7.5%.

The table on the following page lists the actual numbers of reported Index Crimes in Kauai County from 1991 to 2000. During the past 10 years, the population of Kauai County increased 10%. During the same period, the number of reported Index Crimes increased 8.5%. Three of the 8 Index Crimes, robbery, motor vehicle theft, and arson, decreased over the decade.

## Reported Index Offenses Kauai County, 1991-2000





































#### ARREST STATISTICS

Arrest data, including the age, sex, and race/ethnicity of the arrestees, are reported by county law enforcement agencies for all violations except most traffic offenses<sup>1</sup>. The UCR Program requires that an arrest be counted on each separate occasion a person is taken into custody, notified, or cited. As such, arrest figures do not measure the number of individuals arrested since one person may be arrested several times during the year for the same or different types of offenses.

The most severe violation is recorded for each arrest. The violations are divided into two categories: Index Offenses, including murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; and Part II Offenses, comprised of all other offenses, including manslaughter by negligence<sup>2</sup>. Definitions of Index Crimes and Part II Offenses are included in Appendices A and B, respectively.

Race and ethnicity data are presented using categories specific to Hawaii: White, Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Hawaiian/Part-Hawaiian, Korean, Samoan, and Other Asian or Pacific Islanders. Categories typically employed elsewhere in the nation are more restrictive: White, Black, American Indian or Alaskan Native, and Asian or Pacific Islander.

There were a number of new tables introduced in *Crime in Hawaii, 1996.* Primary among these are historical counts of adult and juvenile arrests for the Part II Offense categories. The juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway are traditionally included in Part II. In addition, the status offenses of truancy and ungovernability are included in the Part II arrest category of "All Other Offenses" for juveniles. Arrests for these offenses account for a substantial portion of the Part II and total Index & Part II juvenile arrests. Because these arrest offenses do not exist for adults, any adult-to-juvenile comparison based on traditional Part II totals will be biased in favor of adults. The table on page 116 has dealt with this shortcoming for the separate categories of curfew/loitering and runaway by reporting arrests in these categories separately from other Part II Offense arrests. Curfew and loitering arrests are excluded from the bar chart of the adult and juvenile percentages of the Part II Offense arrests on the same page. Due to space limitations, similar handling was not possible in the 15-year historical tables.

The role that status offenses play in any examination of juvenile arrest trends should also be considered. For example, in 1985, there were 2,771 arrests statewide for the specified status offenses, accounting for 31% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses, and 20% of all juvenile arrests. In 1999, 4,659 statewide status offense arrests were tallied, accounting for 45% of juvenile arrests for Part II Offenses, and 35% of all juvenile arrests.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The division of crime categories is sometimes still made between Part I, an older term that encompassed Index Offenses plus manslaughter by negligence, and Part II, which includes all other offenses. The sections herein on reported offenses (pages 8-101) and arrests (pages 103-163) include manslaughter by negligence with the Part II Offenses for two reasons: 1) the current emphasis of the UCR Program, and this report, is on Index Offenses (which exclude manslaughter by negligence) rather than Part I Offenses; and 2) the FBI's national report, *Crime in the United States*, groups arrest data by Index Offenses and all other offenses; arrests for manslaughter by negligence are excluded entirely.





#### **APPENDIX A**

#### **DEFINITIONS**

**AGGRAVATED ASSAULT:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury; attempted murder. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. It is not necessary that injury result from an aggravated assault when a gun, knife, or other weapon is used which could and probably would result in serious personal injury if the crime were successfully completed. Attacks by personal weapons, such as hands, fists, feet, etc., which result in serious or aggravated injury.

**ARSON:** Any willful or malicious burning or attempt to burn, with or without intent to defraud, a dwelling house, public building, motor vehicle or aircraft, personal property of another, etc.

**ASSAULT:** An unlawful attack by one person upon another. Includes Aggravated Assault (Part I Offense) and Other Assaults (Part II Offense).

**BURGLARY:** The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry where no force is used, and attempted forcible entry where no entry occurs.

**CLEARANCE:** An offense is "cleared" either by arrest or exceptional means. An offense is cleared by arrest when at least one person is arrested; charged with the commission of the offense; and turned over to the court for prosecution. An offense is cleared by exceptional means when the identity of the offender is known; there is enough evidence to support an arrest, charge, and turning over to the court for prosecution; the exact location of the offender is known; and, for reasons outside the control of law enforcement, the offender cannot be arrested, charged, and prosecuted. Examples of offenses cleared by exceptional means include suicide of the offender, double murder, deathbed confession, and denied extradition. It should be noted that the number of offenses and not the number of persons arrested is used to count clearances. Several offenses may be cleared by the arrest of one person; or the arrest of several people may clear only one offense.

**CRIME INDEX:** The eight Part I Offenses reported in the Uniform Crime Reporting Program to represent the status of crime in the United States: murder and nonnegligent manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larcenytheft, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

**CRIME RATE:** The number of crimes per 100,000 population (usually the resident population): Crime Rate =  $\frac{\text{Number of Crimes } \times 100,000}{\text{Resident Population}}$ 

More accurate crime rates (e.g., the number of rapes per 100,000 females or the number of motor vehicle thefts per 100,000 vehicles) are not reported in *Crime in the U.S.* and, therefore, are not used in *Crime in Hawaii*.

**CRIMINAL HOMICIDE:** The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another or the killing of another person through gross negligence. Includes Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (the latter term is not used in Hawaii), and Manslaughter by Negligence.

**DE FACTO POPULATION**: The number of persons physically present in an area, regardless of military status or usual place of residence. Includes visitors present and excludes residents temporarily absent.

**FORCIBLE RAPE:** The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. Assaults or attempts to commit rape by force or threat of force are also included. Statutory rape (without force), any sexual assaults against males, and other sex offenses are not included in this category.

**JUVENILE:** Person under the age of 18.

**LARCENY-THEFT:** The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession or constructive possession of another. Includes pocket-picking, purse-snatching, shoplifting, theft from motor vehicles, theft of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycles, etc. Does not include embezzlement, forgery, or motor vehicle theft.

**MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT:** The theft or attempted theft of a motor vehicle.

**MURDER:** The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another.

**NONVIOLENT OFFENSES:** Included are the offense categories of larceny-theft, burglary, and auto theft. Often referred to as Property Offenses (excluding robbery).

**PART I OFFENSES:** Offenses which make up the Crime Index: murder, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; plus the offense of manslaughter by negligence.

**PART II OFFENSES:** All criminal offenses not classified as Part I Offenses. Also included are the juvenile status offenses of curfew/loitering violation and runaway. See Appendix B for specific Part II Offense definitions.

**PROPERTY OFFENSES:** Included are the offense categories of larceny-theft, burglary, auto theft, and arson. Robbery is classified as a violent crime due to the use or threat of force.

**RESIDENT POPULATION:** The number of persons whose usual place of residence is in an area, regardless of physical location on the estimated census date. Includes military personnel stationed or homeported in the area and excludes persons of local origin attending school or in military service outside the area.

**ROBBERY:** The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim(s) in fear. While robbery has the attributes of a property crime, it is grouped with violent crimes due to the additional attribute of force or the threat of force.

**VIOLENT OFFENSES**: Included are the offense categories of murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault.

#### **APPENDIX B**

#### PART II OFFENSES

#### **CRIMINAL OFFENSES**

**ASSAULT, OTHER:** Assaults and attempted assaults where no weapon was used or which did not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim. Examples include simple assault, assault and battery, resisting or obstructing an officer, intimidation, coercion, and hazing.

**DISORDERLY CONDUCT:** Committing a breach of the peace. Includes affray; unlawful assembly; disturbing the peace; disturbing meetings; and blasphemy, profanity, and obscene language.

**DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE:** Driving or operating any vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of intoxicants.

**DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS:** Includes all violations of state and local laws relating to the unlawful possession, sale, use, growing, manufacturing, and making of illegal drugs.

**EMBEZZLEMENT:** Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

**FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING:** All offenses dealing with the making, altering, uttering, or possession of, with intent to defraud, anything false in the semblance of what is true.

**FRAUD**: Fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. Includes bad checks (except forgeries and counterfeiting), confidence games, and unauthorized withdrawal of money from an automatic teller machine.

**GAMBLING:** Promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling. Includes 3 subcategories: bookmaking, numbers and lottery, and "other" gambling.

**LIQUOR LAWS:** Includes unlawful manufacture, sale, transporting, furnishing, possessing intoxicating liquor; maintaining unlawful drinking places; bootlegging; operating a still; furnishing liquor to a minor; and drinking on a train or public conveyance. Do not include Drunkenness and Driving Under the Influence.

**MANSLAUGHTER BY NEGLIGENCE**: The killing of another person through gross negligence. Manslaughter by negligence is considered a Part I Offense, but is not included in the Crime Index.

**OFFENSES AGAINST THE FAMILY AND CHILDREN**: Include all charges of nonsupport, and neglect or abuse of family and children. Examples include desertion, abandonment, or nonsupport of spouse or child; neglect or abuse of spouse or child; and nonpayment of alimony.

**PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE:** Sex offenses of a commercialized nature. Include prostitution; keeping a bawdy house, disorderly house, or house of ill fame; pandering, procuring, transporting, or detaining women for immoral purposes, etc.; and all attempts.

**SEX OFFENSES:** Includes indecent exposure, incest, statutory rape (no force), any sexual assaults against males, other offenses against common decency and morals, and all attempts. Do not include forcible rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice.

**STOLEN PROPERTY:** Buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, including attempts.

**VAGRANCY:** Persons arrested on grounds of "suspicion" may be prosecuted on this charge. Includes vagrancy, begging, loitering (persons 18 and over), and vagabondage.

**VANDALISM:** The willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of any public or private property, real or personal, without consent of the owner or person having custody or control by cutting, tearing, breaking, marking, painting, drawing, covering with filth, or any other such means as may be specified by local law.

**WEAPONS OFFENSES:** Includes unlawful manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; unlawful carrying of deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc. silencers; furnishing deadly weapons to a minor; and all attempts to commit any of the above.

**ALL OTHER OFFENSES:** Includes all other state and local offenses (excluding traffic violations) not included elsewhere. Examples are:

- Admitting minors to improper places
- Abduction and compelling to marry
- Bigamy and polygamy
- Blackmail and extortion
- Combination in restraint of trade; trusts, monopolies
- Contempt of court
- Criminal anarchism
- Discrimination, unfair competition
- Kidnapping
- Marriage within prohibited degrees
- Offenses contributing to juvenile delinquency, such as employment of children in immoral vocations or practices
- Perjury and subornation of perjury
- Possession, repair, manufacture, etc. of burglar's tools
- Possession of drug paraphernalia
- Possession or sale of obscene literature, pictures, etc.
- Public nuisances
- Riot and rout
- Trespass
- Unlawfully bringing drugs and liquor into state prisons, hospitals, etc.; furnishing to Convicts
- Violations of state regulatory laws and municipal ordinances
- Violation of quarantine
- Truancy (non-criminal juvenile status offense)
- Ungovernability (non-criminal juvenile status offense)
- · All offenses not otherwise classified
- All attempts to commit any of the above

#### **NONCRIMINAL OFFENSES**

**STATUS OFFENSES (PERSONS UNDER 18):** Non-criminal acts or conduct which are offenses only when committed or engaged in by juveniles; include curfew violation and runaways.

**CURFEW AND LOITERING:** Included are violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

**RUNAWAYS:** Apprehension for protective custody as defined by local statute.


#### **NONCRIMINAL ARREST CATEGORY**

**SUSPICION:** While "suspicion" is not an offense, it may be the grounds for many arrests in those jurisdictions where the law permits. After examination by law enforcement officers, the prisoner is either formally charged or released. Those formally charged are entered in one of the Part I or Part II offense classes. This class is limited to "suspicion" arrests where persons arrested are released by the police.

#### Police Officers Assaulted State of Hawaii, 1986-2000




In 2000, the number of police officers assaulted in the line of duty in the State of Hawaii was the second lowest on record since the start of statewide data collection in 1975. The graph above demonstrates the trend of assaults on officers during the past 15 years. From 1986 to 2000, the number of such assaults decreased 47.5%, from 503 in 1986 to 264 in 2000. There was a 3.9% increase in assaults from 1999 to 2000. In 1999, there were 254 assaults and 264 in 2000.


By county, assaults on officers were distributed as follows: 74.6% (197) to the City & County of Honolulu, 11.7% (31) to Maui County, 10.6% (28) to Hawaii County, and 3.0% (8) to Kauai County.

Most of the assaults on police officers during 2000 occurred when responding to disturbance calls (131, 49.6%). Attempting an arrest posed the second greatest risk of assault for police officers (53, 20.1%). Traffic pursuits and stops accounted for 25 assaults (9.5%). Eighteen of the assaults (6.8%) occurred while handling or transporting prisoners, and 11 (4.2%) occurred while investigating suspicious persons.


The use of physical force was most often the means of assault. In 2000, 83.3% (220) of the officers assaulted were assaulted by hands, fists, or other bodily means. The bar graphs below show the breakdown of weapons used in assaults and the type of assignment local police officers were on when they were assaulted.

#### Law Enforcement Officers Assaulted State of Hawaii, 2000






#### Number of Police Officers Assaulted Per 100 Full-Time Officers State of Hawaii, 1986-2000



On December 31, 2000, 2,788 full-time police officers were employed by the county police departments. The 264 assaults on police officers resulted in a rate of 9.5 attacks per 100 police officers statewide for 2000.



During 2000, 42.8% (113) of all assaults on police officers occurred between 10:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m. and another 18.9% (50) occurred between 6:00 p.m. and10:00 p.m.

#### APPENDIX D

#### POPULATION ESTIMATES

State and county resident population estimates for *Crime in Hawaii 2000* were provided by the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism (DBEDT).

The United States census of population is taken as of April 1 in each year ending in zero. Intercensal population estimates are made as of July 1 in each non-census year. Estimates based on the just completed census are also made for July 1 of census years. While the FBI continues to use exact census populations to calculate crime rates in census years, *Crime in Hawaii* 2000 used July 1 estimated populations to determine crime rates for all years. In so doing, a regular progression of estimates taken at 12-month intervals is available to more accurately reflect crime rate trends.
