### Why Should We Care?

- Prescription drug abuse rates in the U.S. are high. Approximately 6.8 million Americans abuse prescription drugs rather than abusing heroin, LSD, and inhalants.
- Most prescription drug abusers get pills from family and friends.
- Hawaii is 1 of 29 states where drug overdose deaths exceeded vehicle accident deaths.

### State of Hawaii

#### Prescription Drug Disposal Law:

- Hawaii pharmacies, hospitals, clinics, physicians are **not allowed** to take back your unused medications.
- You can turn in your unused or expired medication at a Hawaii Medication Drop Box Program.
