**SUBJECT:** Solicitation of Applications for the FY 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice

Assistance Grant (JAG)

Applications from state and county government agencies are being solicited for funding under the FY 2023 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program that is administered by the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), U.S. Department of Justice. Approximately \$1,296,241 is available.

The purpose of the JAG grant is to allow states and local governments to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system.

Applications must support one of the following JAG Federal Program Areas:

- Law enforcement programs
- Prosecution and court programs
- Prevention and education programs
- Corrections and community corrections programs
- Drug treatment and enforcement programs
- Planning, evaluation and technology improvement programs
- Mental health programs
- Implementation of state crisis intervention court proceedings and related programs or initiatives

Applications should also address at least one of the State's Priority Areas/Strategic Plan Goals:

Goal 1: Reduce the impact of drug crime

Goal 2: Reduce the barriers to community integration

- Goal 3: Support capacity building and coordination
- Goal 4: Support the State's and/or County's ability to address urgent/emergent criminal justice issues (Descriptions of the urgent/emergent criminal justice issues are attached for your reference.)

<u>All applications must be approved by the agency/department head</u> – e.g., director, chief of police, prosecuting attorney, administrative director of the courts, etc. The agency/department head must provide their approval by signing off on each application's abstract to acknowledge their review.
