ORDER GRANTING PETITIONER'S MOTION  
FOR ORDER JUDICIALLY DISSOLVING THE

AND DECREE OF DISSOLUTION

Petitioner DAVID M. LOUIE'S Motion for Order Judicially  
Dissolving Wailuku Main Street Association, Inc/Tri-Isle  
Resource Center (Filed June 25 2013) (the "Motion) came on for

hearing on September 4, 2013 before the Honorable Joseph E. Cardoza. Deputy Attorney General Hugh R. Jones appeared for the Petitioner and Respondent Thomas R. Cannon appeared Pro Se. Deputy Corporation Counsel Caleb P. Rowe was also present at the hearing.

The Court, being fully advised in the premises, and based upon the records and files herein and argument at the hearing of the Motion, and for good cause shown, GRANTS the Motion and accordingly it is ordered and decreed as follows.

1. Pursuant to section 414D-252(a)(4) the Court Orders that the Wailuku Main Street Association, Inc./Tri-Isle Resource Center (the "Corporation") is hereby dissolved because it is a public benefit corporation and no longer able to carry out its activities for the reasons shown in the Motion.

2. Pursuant to section 414D-255(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Clerk of the Circuit Court is directed to deliver to the Director of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, State of Hawaii, a certified copy of this order.

3. Pursuant to section 414D-254, Hawaii Revised Statutes, the Court appoints William McKeon, Esq. as a Receiver for all assets, real and tangible property of the Corporation.

4. The Receiver shall have all the powers set forth in section 14D-254(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes and shall have all powers necessary to marshal the assets of the Corporation, pay

creditors of the Corporation, to give notice to Claimants and to wind up the Corporation's affairs.

5. Pursuant to section 414D-252(c), Hawaii revised Statutes, all persons having custody or control of the real or personal property of the Corporation, or any other asset belonging to the Corporation shall and are hereby ordered turn over such property to the Receiver within 30 days from the entry of this order. Any person having custody or control of assets of the Corporation is hereby enjoined from disposing, destroying or transferring the same to any person other than the Receiver.

6. After the payment of creditors, the Receiver is directed to distribute any remaining assets of the Corporation in a manner consistent with the Corporations Articles of Incorporation and section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and the Corporation's bylaws.

7. The Receiver shall act prudently with respect to the distribution of any documents of the Corporation that would, if disclosed, violate an individual's right to privacy or reveal trade secrets, including the destruction of those records if the Receiver deems it appropriate.
