**DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO CONDUCT AN AUCTION OF FORFEITED PROPERTY**

Attorney General Earl I. Anzai announced today that a public auction of property forfeited to the State of Hawaii will be held on February 9, 2002, at the Ala Wai Golf Course Club House, Honolulu, Hawaii. The auction will be conducted by Rosen Auctions. The property to be sold includes, a 1995 Chevrolet stepside pickup, a 1990 Ford Mustang, a 1984 Chevrolet Corvette, a 1997 Honda Shadow motorcycle, a Yamaha Twin 350 ATV and a Honda Fourtrax ATV, two canoe paddles, stereo equipment, cameras, tools, assorted jewelry, and other property. The property to be sold may be inspected from 11:00 a.m. The auction will begin at 12:00 p.m. This auction is the result of ongoing efforts by State and County law enforcement agencies to fight crime by seizing and forfeiting assets used or acquired in connection with criminal activities. The proceeds from this auction will be used by state and county law enforcement agencies to combat crime.

Assets that were used in, or obtained from, the commission of certain criminal offenses can be

seized and forfeited under the State=s Asset Forfeiture law. Taking away a criminal's tools used to commit crimes and the profits from those crimes is a way to deter and impede criminal conduct. Employees (and their immediate family members) of each county police department, each prosecuting attorney's office, and the Department of the State Attorney General are not eligible to purchase forfeited property.
