How To Place A Fraud Alert

Follow the 8 Easy Steps:

Call 1-800-525-6285
Welcome to the Equifax Automated Fraud and Active Duty Alert System.

PRESS 1 To add an "Initial 90-Day" fraud alert to the credit file.

ENTER 9-digit Social Security number.

ENTER Number of your street address.
(For example: for 123 5th Avenue, enter ONLY the numbers 123.)

ENTER Last 2-digits of your birth year.

ENTER Day phone number with area code.
(The area code for Hawaii is 808.)

ENTER Evening phone number with area code.
(The area code for Hawaii is 808.)

Other Options:

PRESS 2 To add an "Active Duty/Military" alert to the credit file.

PRESS 3 To add an "Extended 7-year" fraud alert to the credit file.

PRESS 4 If you are a personal representative and would like to add a fraud or active duty alert to the consumer's credit file.

If you successfully notify Equifax, they will share your fraud alert request with the other national credit reporting agencies, Experian and TransUnion. Fraud alerts will be automatically added to your credit reports with these reporting agencies. You will not need to contact these companies to request a fraud alert.

If, for some reason your request is unable to be processed, you will need to submit your request in writing with the following pieces of information:

- i. Full Name
- ii. Current and Former Addresses
- iii. Social Security Number
- iv. Date of Birth
- v. A copy of your Driver's License or Utility Bill to confirm your current address
- vi. An official document containing your Social Security Number (ex: Social Security Card, Pay Stub, W2 Form)
