## TWO CHARGED WITH FELONY WELFARE FRAUD

HONOLULU – Attorney General Doug Chin today announced that welfare fraud charges have been filed against Leslie K. Harada and Robert J. Moniz.

Harada is charged with first-degree theft. The complaint against Harada, a 45-year old Waipahu resident, alleges that between September 1, 2011 and July 31, 2016, she applied for and received public assistance benefits to which she was not entitled. This resulted in the Department of Human Services (DHS) making more than \$20,000 in overpayments to Harada.

Moniz is charged with one count of second-degree theft and two counts of third-degree theft. The complaint against Moniz, a 41-year old Waianae resident, alleges that during three different timeframes from 2010 to 2015, he applied for and received public assistance benefits to which he was not entitled. This resulted in DHS making more than \$300 in overpayments (second-degree theft) and more than \$100 in overpayments (third-degree theft) to Moniz.

**Attorney General Doug Chin** said, "Public assistance benefits need to go to people who need them. We will prosecute anyone who abuses the system."

First-degree theft is punishable by up to ten years in prison and a \$25,000 fine. Seconddegree theft is punishable by up to five years in prison and a \$10,000 fine. Third-degree theft is punishable by up to one year in jail and a \$2,000 fine. Harada and Moniz are both presumed innocent unless and until they are found guilty of the charges beyond a reasonable doubt. Copies of the felony informations are attached.

HARADA, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did intentionally obtain or exert control over the property of another having a value which exceeds Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20, 000.00), to wit, public assistance benefits, by deception, with intent to deprive another of the property, thereby committing the offense of Theft in the First Degree in violation of Sections 708-830(2) and 708-830.5(1)(a), of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

## FELONY INFORMATION AND NON-FELONY COMPLAINT

The STATE OF HAWAII, through the undersigned, its Deputy Attorney General, hereby

accuses and charges the Defendant as follows:

### Count I:

On or about January 1, 2010, to and including August 31, 2011, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, ROBERT J. MONIZ, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did intentionally obtain or exert control over the property of another having a value which exceeds Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00), to wit, public assistance benefits, by deception, with intent to deprive another of the property, the discovery of which did not occur until on or about October 9, 2015, thereby committing the offense of Theft in the Second Degree in violation of Sections 708-830(2) and 708-831(1)(b) of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

On or about February 13, 2013, to and including July 31, 2013, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, ROBERT J. MONIZ, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did intentionally obtain or exert control over the property of another having a value which exceeds One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), to wit, public assistance benefits, by deception, with intent to deprive another of the property, the discovery of which did not occur until on or about October 9, 2015, thereby committing the offense of Theft in the Third Degree in violation of Sections 708-830(2) and 708-832(1)(a) of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

#### Count III:

On or about December 1, 2014, to and including March 31, 2015, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, ROBERT J. MONIZ, as one scheme and/or continuing course of conduct, did intentionally obtain or exert control over the property of another having a value which exceeds Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$100.00), to wit, public assistance benefits, by deception, with intent to deprive another of the property, the discovery of which did not occur

until on or about October 9, 2015, thereby committing the offense of Theft in the Third Degree in violation of Sections 708-830(2) and 708-832(1)(a) of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.
