FURLOUGH ESCAPEE CHARGED

HONOLULU – Attorney General Doug Chin announced that felony information charges were filed today against Michael Jay. He is charged with escape in the second degree, a class C felony punishable by up to five years in prison.

On November 21, 2016, Jay, an inmate at the Oahu Community Correctional Center's (OCCC) Laumaka Work Furlough Center, left the center without permission. He was apprehended by deputy sheriffs and the U.S. Marshalls on December 1, 2016.

Attorney General Chin said: "Abuse of work furlough privileges must not be tolerated. My office will vigorously pursue felony escape charges where warranted."

Jay is presumed innocent unless and until he is found guilty of the charges beyond a reasonable doubt. A copy of the information and a photograph of Jay is attached.

FELONY INFORMATION

The Department of the Attorney General charges:

On or about November 21, 2016, to and including December 1, 2016, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, MICHAEL JAY, did intentionally escape from a correctional or detention facility or from custody, to wit, The Oahu Community Correctional Center, Community Based Section, which is a placed used for the confinement of persons arrested for, charged with, or convicted of a criminal offense or otherwise confined pursuant to an order of a court, thereby committing the offense of ESCAPE IN THE SECOND DEGREE, in violation of Section 710-1021 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.
