LABAR CHARGED WITH ESCAPE IN THE SECOND DEGREE

HONOLULU – Attorney General Doug Chin announced that Gregory A. Labar was charged today with Escape in the Second Degree.

On September 28, 2017, Labar escaped from a correctional or detention facility, or from custody. A bench warrant for his arrest was issued.

Escape in the Second Degree is a class C felony and carries a maximum sentence of 5 years in prison and a \$10,000.00 fine.

Labar is presumed innocent unless and until he is found guilty of the charges beyond a reasonable doubt.

FELONY INFORMATION

The Department of the Attorney General charges:

On or about the 28th day of September, 2017, in the City and County of Honolulu, State of Hawaii, GREGORY A. LABAR, did intentionally escape from a correctional or detention facility, or from custody, thereby committing the offense of Escape in the Second Degree, in violation of Section 710-1021 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes.

“Detention facility” means any place used for the confinement of a person: (a) Arrested for, charged with, or convicted of a criminal offense; or (b) Confined pursuant to chapter 571; or (c) Held for extradition; or (d) Otherwise confined pursuant to an order of a court.

“Custody” means restraint by a public servant pursuant to arrest, detention, or order of a court.

“Public servant” means any officer or employee of any branch of government, whether elected, appointed, or otherwise employed, and any person participating as advisor, consultant, or otherwise, in performing a governmental function, but the term does not include jurors or witnesses.
