FORMER KAUAI POLICE OFFICER CONVICTED OF CYBERSTALKING

HONOLULU – A Kauai jury returned a guilty verdict last week for Lihue resident Damian Loo of Harassment by Stalking and Use of a Computer in the Commission of a Separate Crime.

While employed at the Kauai Police Department, Loo, 49, used the Department's computer surveillance system to watch a civilian female co-worker as she came and went to work from March 22, 2017 to April 13, 2017. The recording capacity of the system would not allow for retrieval of footage prior to March 22, 2017. The investigation was conducted by the Kauai Police Department and referred to the Department of the Attorney General for prosecution. Deputy Attorney General Michelle Puu successfully prosecuted the case for the Department.

Harassment by Stalking is a misdemeanor with a maximum sentence of one year in jail and a \$2,000.00 fine. Use of a Computer in the Commission of a Separate Crime is a class C felony and carries a maximum sentence of five years in prison and a \$10,000.00 fine.

Sentencing is scheduled for August 16, 2018 at 8:00 a.m. before the Honorable Randal G.B. Valenciano.
