HONOLULU – The Department of the Attorney General, U.S. Attorney's Office - District of Hawaii, Weed and Seed Hawaii, Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs - Office of the Securities Commissioner, and Honolulu Police Department, along with other community partners are coordinating the <u>Celebrate Safe Communities Day on</u> <u>Saturday, October 12, 2019, 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m. at Pearlridge Center, Wai Makai (formerly Downtown) Mall</u>. This is a free event for the entire community.

This partnership was formed so these federal, state, and county agencies and other service providers could better work together to keep communities safe from crime, fraud, and disasters.

"Since 2012, the partnership has coordinated this event to help educate our community on all the different ways to keep safe," said Attorney General Clare E. Connors. There will be over 40 interactive booths and displays at the Wai Makai Mall and First Floor levels; along with static displays in the TJ Maxx parking lot. Free reusable Celebrate Safe Communities bags will be distributed on a first come first serve basis while supplies last.
