**RECIPIENT’S RIGHTS**

You have been served with an investigative subpoena in an administrative investigation, issued by the Attorney General of the State of Hawaii, in accordance with section 28-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to produce certain records and information, and to appear at the time and place specified to give sworn testimony. **Please reach out to the “Contact Person” listed above if the box is checked that you are not required to appear in person for testimony.** Attendance is required only in the county in which the subpoena is served, or such other place as may be agreed upon by you and the issuing authority. If the subpoena is served in a county other than that in which you reside, are employed, or transact business, the Department of the Attorney General shall bear the expense of travel as provided by the rules of the court.

If you disobey this subpoena, the Attorney General may apply to the circuit court in the county in which you reside or are located to compel obedience. Prior to the date on which you are commanded to appear, you may move the circuit court to quash or modify the subpoena if compliance would be unreasonable or oppressive or violate any privilege you may be entitled to exercise in a court proceeding.

## EXHIBIT 1

1. For all current Fire and Rescue Operations Division personnel, from date of hire to August 8, 2023, in CSV, XLS, and/or XML format if available, or in its native format:
  - a. All training/certification records (e.g., online, classroom, hands-on) supporting the following operational areas and topics:
    - Wildland firefighting (including weather and fuel/vegetation),
    - Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) firefighting,
    - Structural firefighting,
    - Incident management/command/organization,
    - Emergency medical care and/or first aid, and
    - Radio operations.
  - b. All records regarding all current and past qualifications pertaining to wildfire, WUI and All Hazard Incidents from the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG), National Incident Management System (NIMS), and/or any other equivalent recognized qualification system.
2. Any and all records of mandatory and/or recommended educational and training requirements for each position within the Fire and Rescue Operations Division.
3. All records of personnel deployment assignments, i.e., performance in a trainee role during an emergency incident in another jurisdiction (e.g., Hawai'i Island, California, etc.) for all Fire and Rescue Operations Division personnel from 2018 up to and including 2023.
4. All evacuation plans and analyses.
5. All After Action Reports (AARs) related to any and all wildfire incidents, WUI incidents, or mass evacuations, from 2018 up to and including 2023.
6. All draft or completed fire incident reports for the Lahaina, Kula, Kihei, and Olinda fires that were initially reported on August 8, 2023.
