YOU ARE HEREBY COMMANDED to appear at the County of Maui Service Center, 110 Alaihi Street, Room 207, Wailuku, Hawaii 96732, on the 4th day of January, 2024, at 1 p.m. to be examined under oath regarding: Actions taken by Maui Police Department (MPD) personnel to confirm fatalities and to document the locations and identities of the deceased during and after the fire event that took place in Lahaina beginning on August 8, 2023, including (1) actions taken to staff and organize MPD's efforts to confirm and document fatalities, and (2) the progression of MPD's efforts as the number of confirmed fatalities increased.

This subpoena is issued pursuant to section 28-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

OBEDIENCE to this subpoena may be enforced by the Circuit Court of the Second Circuit.

RECIPIENT’S RIGHTS

You have been served with an investigative subpoena in an administrative investigation, issued by the Attorney General of the State of Hawaii, in accordance with section 28-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to produce certain records and information, and to appear at the time and place specified to give sworn testimony. Attendance is required only in the county in which the subpoena is served, or such other place as may be agreed upon by you and the issuing authority. If the subpoena is served in a county other than that in which you reside, are employed, or transact business, the Department of the Attorney General shall bear the expense of travel as provided by the rules of the court.

If you disobey this subpoena, the Attorney General may apply to the circuit court in the county in which you reside or are located to compel obedience. Prior to the date on which you are commanded to appear, you may move the circuit court to quash or modify the subpoena if compliance would be unreasonable or oppressive or violate any privilege you may be entitled to exercise in a court proceeding.
