#### **Summary of Duties:**

The Criminal Justice Division prosecutes a variety of criminal cases, including public corruption, welfare and tax fraud, white collar crime, Internet crimes against children, child sexual exploitation, sex offender registration violations, homicides, sexual assaults, abuse and neglect cases, unauthorized practice of law, environmental crimes, cases conflicted from the counties, and other cases involving matters of statewide concern or involving state officials or employees.

The Division also assists in the coordination of state and county law enforcement efforts; participates on numerous committees, boards, coalitions, and task forces on criminal justice matters; provides legal support to state departments on criminal justice issues; and attempts to improve state criminal laws and the criminal justice system through legislative advocacy.

The Division also includes the following specialized units and programs: the Hawaii Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, the Tobacco Tax Enforcement Unit, and the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit. The Division administers the Law Enforcement Officer Safety Act (LEOSA) program, and provides administrative support to the Law Enforcement Standards Board.

These deputy attorneys general will be primarily responsible for criminal prosecutions and appeals statewide; legal advice and assistance on criminal matters; criminal legislation; and other responsibilities placed upon the Criminal Justice Division.

#### **Minimum Requirements:**

Education/Experience: Graduate from an accredited law school.

Knowledge/Ability: Knowledge of applicable State and Federal laws, rules, regulations and computer
applications/software. Awareness of both federal district and state court of rules of civil and criminal
procedure, including the Local Rules of Practice for the United States District Court for the District of
Hawaii and the Hawaii Rules of the Circuit Courts and District Courts.

Ability to perform legal research, analyze, manage, produce and organize documents as needed, understand and apply administrative rules and court rules; give and receive oral and written instructions; use computer. Appropriate and current legal writing skills, including the ability to write logically and persuasively. Ability to set personal and professional example; leadership, supervisory or administrative ability or knowledge; strong organizational skills; good communication skills.

License/Certificate: Active Hawaii State Bar License to practice law in all courts of the State of Hawaii
and the United States District Court for the District of Hawaii.
