ANNUAL REPORT ON INCIDENTS OF UNNECESSARY OR EXCESSIVE FORCE ON ARRESTEES BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Pursuant to section 803-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes

For Calendar Year 2024

Submitted to the Thirty-Third State Legislature Regular Session of 2025

Section 803-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), requires each relevant department director and county police department chief to submit an annual report of incidents of unnecessary or excessive force on arrestees that were reported by law enforcement officers to their supervisors during each calendar year.

Section 803-7(b), HRS, provides that: A law enforcement officer who reasonably believes that another law enforcement officer is using unnecessary or excessive force on an arrestee that violates an applicable law or departmental policy shall have a duty to:

- (1) Immediately intervene to prevent the use of unnecessary or excessive force by the other law enforcement officer; provided that the intervention can be safely accomplished; and
- (2) Report the incident to the other law enforcement officer's supervisor as soon as practicable.

The reporting required is on incidents reported pursuant to section 803-7(b).

The Department of the Attorney General did not have any incidents of unnecessary or excessive force on arrestees during the reporting period January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2024.
