When the Chairperson asks for public testimony, you may click the Raise Hand button found on your Zoom screen to indicate that you wish to testify about that agenda item. The Chairperson will individually enable each testifier to unmute their microphone. When recognized by the Chairperson, please unmute your microphone before speaking and mute your microphone after you finish speaking.

PHONE ACCESS:

If you cannot get internet access, you may get audio-only access by calling the phone number listed above. Upon dialing the number, you will be prompted to enter the Meeting ID listed on the first page of the notice of meeting above. After entering the Meeting ID, you will be asked to either enter your panelist number or wait to be admitted into the meeting. If you are a member of the public, you will not have a panelist number. - **Summary:** Exempts certain positions of the Law Enforcement Standards Board from the State's civil service law and collective bargaining requirements.

3. HB 1976, HD1, SD1 (new version), Relating to Dementia

Companion Bill: SB 2867

- **Summary:** Requires the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, fire chiefs, Law Enforcement Standards Board, and Department of Health to make available at least one hour of dementia-specific training for first responders, including law enforcement officers, fire first responders, and emergency medical services personnel.
